Reuben Dip

1 – 16 oz can sauerkraut – drain 8 oz Swiss cheese shredded or grated 2 pkgs. Buddig dried or corned beef cut up or -- (I used (1) jar Armour dried beef (blue label) and cut it up 1 cup mayonnaise 1 small jar chopped ripe olives

Mix ingredients well Bake at 350 degrees for 30-35 minutes.

Serve with party rye bread

Chicken and Grape Salad

1 Medium baked, roasted, or rotisserie chicken

½ cup finely minced celery

1 cup grapes - halved

1 small red Delicious apple (optional)

2 tablespoons Lemon Pepper Seasoning (optional)

1 cup Miracle Whip

2 tablespoons sugar

1 teaspoon lemon juice

½ cup Cashews, chopped

Shred or chop chicken into bite-sized pieces. Use the whole chicken – white and dark meat. Add the celery and grapes. Mix the sugar and lemon juice with the Miracle Whip and fold into chicken mixture. Top with chopped Cashews just before serving.

This salad is best served when it has chilled for a couple of hours. This recipe will serve 6 - 8 people.




