Minutes from October 17, 2013 IQG Meeting

The meeting was called to order by President Kathy Poole at 7:00 pm.



2014 Quilt Show STARS OVER TEXAS


33 weeks to go before the Quilt Show.

TECHNIQUE: Any quilting technique and miniature pattern.


Must have label (IQG, Maker, Quilter and Date) and 2 inch sleeve on the back for hanging.

(Second Monday - 6 - 9 pm - Jaycee Park, 2018 Puritan)


