March---- show project #1 (roll dice for # of next project)

June ----- show project (number chosen by rolling dice)

September---show project (number chosen by rolling dice)

December--- show project (number chosen by rolling dice)

The first project will be of your choice to complete and show in March.

In March we will roll dice and the number that comes up will be your next project to finish. Then in June and September we will roll the dice for the number of the next project to

complete. Each time you bring your finished project in and show it, your name will go in for the drawing in December for the grand prize which will be the money everyone paid to enter the challenge.

So the more projects finished, the more times you have a chance to win and be crowned THE QUEEN OF THE UFO'S, yes we will crown the winner QUEEN. Now what other challenge can you enter for 5.00, get UFO's finished and have a change to be crowned queen. The previous winners will be her court.

The rules are simple: A UFO is any piece of fabric, cut into for the purpose of making a quilt, wall hanging or other object of art that is made of fabric totally or partially.

Examples: block put together for a quilt top, a completed block, finishing a quilt (quilted & bound), etc.

The goal is to finish the six UFO's but if you have a project that you haven't finished, set your goal to finish the blocks, border, etc so you are that much closer to finishing that UFO.

For this challenge ONE BINDING will be allowed as one of your UFO's.

- Make a COPY of the form to keep for your records.
- Turn in a copy of UFO form and \$5.00 to the guild meeting in February (money is for the UFO Queen and her Court).
- I will have a drawing each month that we show a completed UFO and that person's name will be in the drawing for the Queen's Court.
- At the December meeting will have our usual drawing for the Queen's Court. Then, we will have a special drawing for the Queen from all of

the previous winners and crown the UFO Queen!!

This will be a great way to have some fun and get our UFO's done!!
