The Meeting was called to order at 7:00p.m.

The minutes from the last meeting were approved as printed.

Barbara Martin announced the Quilt show in Duncan Ok, March 28-29<sup>th</sup>. The Texhoma One Stop Shop Hop in Wichita Falls March 28-29<sup>th</sup>.

Tonya Terry presented Kathy Poole with her President's quilt top and a project bag.

Gail Walsh read a thank you note from the Arlington Guild for allowing them to bring their raffle quilt and sell tickets. She needs volunteers to sit with the quilt at Quilters Dream February 27 and some members volunteered. She also along with Barbara Martin announced that a Raffle Committee Chairman is needed and the 2015 quilt needs to be made this year.

Cynthia Gladden reported about TAQG Rally Day July 12<sup>th</sup>, with lunch tickets for 10.00. The speaker will be Pat Speth "Nichol Quilts". She asked the members to donate at least 20 5 inch squares each for goody bags. We will have a workshop in April to finish cutting and bagging the squares. If you haven't cut the squares and can't be at the workshop bring the fabric to the April meeting.

Janie Merritt (standing in for LaCora McSwain), received several quilt show entries and announced they were online at the website. The entry deadline is April 17<sup>th</sup>.

Kristi Wilson announced that miniature quilts are due by April 30<sup>th</sup>. The size is 6x6-24x24. She already has some miniatures that were donated for the silent auction at the show.

Virginia Bobbitt announced that the scholarship committee has 6 applications and the committee will meet and decide by the middle of March for the recipient.

Sue Gray announced the March 13<sup>th</sup>-16<sup>th</sup> retreat has 32 people going. The cost for three days is 245.25.

Julie Beck went over the programs for 2014 and on the months that we don't have a workshop we can have a sit and sew day, as long as she has 5 people that want to come. She also asks the guild about having Brenda Jeschke back in April 2015 for a workshop. The guild picked Piece and Design with cost around 30.00. The August 2014 speaker will be Tana Mueller and the cost will be 35.00.

Nancy Norris handed out the membership packet that included the membership book, raffle tickets, and a show entry form.

Carol Cook reported that Cynthia Chaffee regional chairman for Quilt of Valor will be at the Dallas Quilt Show. She asked that we go by her booth and say hello. The demand for oversees quilts are decreasing and some are now being sent to rehab centers since there is a need for them at the centers.

Carol Cook announced the April Retreat with the cost of 225.00 for three days. She will take the money at the March meeting.

Yes, I am going to throw down the challenge to all members!


