Linda has made a good start in her UFO project. What an incentive to get those projects completed. I hope that there was a good turnout for the Angel Quilt work shop.



The first UFO Challenge went great with several of the challengers showing their completed UFO.


The color for the April Fat Quarter Lotto is Easter color or pastels.


We now have postcards and will pass them out at the next meeting for you to distribute out to friends and favorite businesses.

If mailed the entry must arrive at my address by April 17, 2014.

- 1. Entries will be accepted on a space available basis. Entries received either after the limit is reached or after the deadline has passed will be returned to the sender.
- 2. Each entrant may submit no more than two entries in any one category. In the Judged category the quilt may not be older than five years and not entered in our previous shows.
