
The UFO due in June will be #2.

Two and a half weeks before the Quilt Show!



Hello to all,

We had a great time at the Garden & Arts building Saturday working on Angel Quilts. There's nothing like the lure of free fabric to get more quilts made! The pattern is very easy to understand and I believe everyone who attended the Saturday class got a fabric kit. These are going to be really neat scrappy quilts!

I now have a supply list for the July workshop where Mary Massey will be teaching 'Not your Gramma's Log Cabin'. I showed her sample at our May Guild meeting so you have an idea of what the pattern will look like. Anyone who takes the class will be provided a pattern as part of the course fee. If you don't take the class you can purchase the pattern separately. The cost for this class is \$30.00.


We absolutely must have 10 people to attend this workshop in order for it to make so I will be asking at the next Guild meeting for a firm commitment. If we don't have 10 students the class will be cancelled.

5 Block starter set of the quilt (just like what was shown at guild meeting) - fat quarters work well:

3 different LIGHT fabrics for logs
3 different DARK fabrics for logs
FOCAL FABRIC for setting squares - something that
will stand out with your color choices
DIFFERENT FABRIC for setting triangles
Border fabric if you want to add a border (sample
shown had a border)

I asked about fabric requirements for a larger size quilt but Mary just said we could add more fabrics as needed. So I don't have requirements on larger sizes. Class price is \$30.00 per student. Remember, I will need a firm commitment on attendance at the June Guild meeting.
