

Sue Gray announced that she would like for volunteers to be turned in to her including Newborns in Need.


Carol Cook and Judy Poole personally delivered a quilt from QOV to a Vietnam vet in Anna, Texas. He was very appreciative.


Yes I did it!! So shoot me.....




August Guild Meeting
