The entry fee will be \$3.00 (for ribbons for the First, Second, and Third place). We will have two judges to judge the quilt entries. The quilt can be no smaller than 10 x by 10 inches and the largest being a twin size.

So let's get ready to have a great time with the Paint Chip Challenge. Let's see how we can use the colors we draw (no matter what the colors are, we can make them into beautiful quilts).
