Lori Vauble gave us information about the June workshop. The class is 30.00 and the kit is 25.00.



Love Thy Baby provides all the fabric so if your stash is short and you want volunteer hours please consider doing blankets for us.

We provide all the fabric needed all you have to do is surge or a rolled hem on the 36×36 flannel. Small quilts 36×36 are completely put together. All you have to do is the quilting on top by meandering or using the stitch in the ditch method.

Thanks to all the ladies that have been taking on the small quilts to do free motion quilting on them, they are looking great and giving you lots of practice.

The count of items donated in May was 350 Receiving Blankets, 42 Quilts and 50 Hats.

Thanks again for all your hard work!

Remember-

- *Small quilts are 2 for 1 hour
- *Surging or rolled hem on the receiving blankets 10 for 1 hour
- *Hats, diaper shirts and booties are 10 for 1 hour
- *Small quilts are 2 for 1 hour

(Second Monday – 6 - 9 pm - Jaycee Park, 2018 Puritan)


The Frayed Knots will meet Monday May 11 at 6:00 at Jaycee Park.
