### **Quilt Show Committee News**

A few Guild meetings ago I randomly polled the members about how they felt about having a quilt show in the future. I told them we wanted to look at a new venue and see if we could improve the price. We had a good showing of hands that said they were open to another show and would enter their quilts. So here are the results of our searches and the committee's tentative plans if you approve:

- 1. The next show would not be until June 2017 (2 years from now). That will give us and the membership more time to start that prize winning show quilt and give the committee a good time frame for securing venders in advance.
- 2. The best location at the cheapest price is Senter Recreation Center and they are very happy to have us. We would be able to get the complete building for all 4 days at a great savings. Also they will work with us for this to become a permanent location. There are 2 gyms plus an open atrium area. There are two rooms on the lower floor that we can have. Ramps for easy access and tons of parking. Also if we wanted there is a large room on the second floor via an elevator or stairs but I don't think we would need it unless we needed storage areas. The 2 gyms would allow for more venders and that would help offset costs even more.
- 3. The committee is determined to advertise the show more aggressively to other guilds by personally attending their meetings and answering questions and inviting them to enter their quilts and attend the show. We feel that we must do this to be successful and take the burdens off of our members to fund the show.

So this is the rough plan as it stands now. Here is the kicker though. In January there was a vote taken about whether or not the membership was willing to have another show. There were Yes, No and Maybe answers. The question was tabled until a future meeting to be re-visited for a final vote. It is now time for that vote. At the June meeting we will have the final vote on whether you want to pursue a quilt show or not. The ballot will be strictly a YES or No answer.

I'm not gonna lie ladies...I hope you vote YES because we have such a good time at our shows and we make such beautiful quilts you should want to show them off !! My fear is if we vote no now, we will never have another show in the future. As members, if you want to enter your quilts in a show you would have to go to other guilds to do it and might end up joining them. But we will go with how you vote in June and as President Barbara put it to me..."That will put an end to it!"
