#### White (kind of) Italian Cream Cake Recipe

I never make a cake from scratch but I do spruce up a cake mix by adding vanilla. Almond extract would be good too. I do not have the exact measurements for this cake but close is still pretty good.

1 yellow cake mix (the mix called for 7 tablespoons of butter, I used the whole melted stick) 1-1.5 cups of toasted coconut 1-1.5 cups of chopped pecans (any nut should be good) 1 tablespoon 1 tablespoon varille (use varille beap pacts and just glop

1 teaspoon -1 tablespoon vanilla (I use vanilla bean paste and just glop it in there)

Add nuts and coconut to dry mix, stir, then add wets according to box and mix as box says. Cook according to box directions.

Meanwhile make the icing. When cake is done poke holes in it with a knife and spread icing over hot cake.

Icing

I did not have any cream cheese or sour cream so I used plain yogurt.

1/4 cup yogurt 1/4 cup melted butter 1 teaspoon – 1 tablespoon vanilla About 1/2 of a one pound bag of powdered sugar 1/2 to ¾ cup of toasted coconut or more if you want (probably doesn't have to be toasted but that is what I had) 3/4- 1 cup of pecans (or more if you want)

Mix all the wets. Mix in powdered sugar until not to thin but not too thick. Add coconut and pecans, if it is too thick add a little bit of milk. Spread over hot cake.

#### **Frayed Knots**

(Second Monday - 6 - 9 pm - Jaycee Park, 2018 Puritan)

The Frayed Knots will meet Monday September 14th at 6:00 at Jaycee Park.

We decided to do a Twisted Robin for our project in 2016. Each participant will bring a block (the pattern if necessary) for each participant to incorporate in their quilt. This can be any block of your choice (Nine Patch, Star block, Four Patch, etc.), or appliqué (flower, leaf, circle, etc.). This doesn't have to be a difficult block, just one that you want everyone to incorporate in their quilt. If someone brings appliqué, you don't have to do it all over the quilt, just the design they wanted in the quilt. For example they brought a flower; you need only use one flower in your quilt. Each person works on their own guilt hence the name Twisted Robin. Each month you will bring the part of the quilt that you have been working on for our show & tell. Each person will have the same blocks or element in their quilt but they will look different with the different layouts and colors.

If it is decided that someone wants to work on another project, that is great as we have some people who work on more than one project at a time or a different project.

I hope everyone will be thinking of what they want incorporated in the quilts. We will be handing out the patterns (**please bring 15 copies for everyone**) at our November meeting so everyone can decide on fabrics and layouts.
