Paper Piecing, Thank you!

Every year I challenge myself to do something new, or learn a new quilting technique. This year, I decided it was to learn the art of Paper Piecing. Yes, I feel eyes rolling at the mere mention of this as for some of you – well maybe most of you; it is as easy as watching the sun rise. For me, it was very intimidating. Just look at the complex, ribbon winning, beautiful quilts we have seen in the past shows. Paper pieced! The most complicated looking quilts hanging on the walls at Compass Centre –Paper pieced! (I have been admiring them for years.) It has to be HARD! Right? At one retreat, I watched intently as my friend Cynthia worked on her quilt for the last Guild show. She made a paper copy for me to try and gave me a printed list of Reminders to refer to. I did it! But after a second attempt at home, I confused myself, got it backwards, and gave up.

Last fall, my friendship group decided that this year's project would be a paper piecing project. So.. to ready myself, I watched U-tube demonstrations, bought a book or two, and took a class at my favorite quilt shop. I bought every kind of paper piecing paper known to womankind. Yes ma'am! I was ready. My group held a 'hands on' class one night to ready those few (ok- two) of us that were unsteady about it. I did it! I went home and put my machine up and my samples away — I was so sure I had it! Yes siree-I've got this! NO PROBLEM! I purchased and cut the background for my quilt. I gathered the other fabrics for each month's block. Yup- I've got this whole thing down pat. I have a plan and I am going to knock it out of the old ball park. Mastered! 2015 Friendship group quilt practically done already!

In December, we received our first block pattern for January. It didn't work out as easily as it had with my friends looking over my shoulder, whispering reminders of what to do next, how to start each block, etc. I fought and fiddled but I got it done. Ha! Then I tried to add the rest of the pieces and it was horrible. Square? Not even close. Okay, I told myself, just put it away and work on it at retreat. So that I did. And what a struggle. I was wearing out everyone around me. Many watched on with disbelief. What a sight. My tub o'fabric was scattered everywhere and paper was flying! That evening, I wandered around the floor and watched over Kathy's shoulder. Lori reminded me of the tips she taught me at the hands on class. Mae showed me the beauty of a glue stick and came and sat with me. Judy nodded her approval as she surfed the web. Carol snuck in early one morning and 'fixed' a few of the blocks. Then she sat with me for half the morning until I got it down. Hammered down! I came home and put away everything. Exhausting! Three weeks later I pulled it all out and like magic, the paper pieced strips turned in to blocks. Finally-I think I've got it! At least for now -----

So I challenge you – join a friendship group and share the fun!

Thanks to all the ladies that have been taking on the small quilts to do free motion quilting on them, they are looking great and giving you lots of practice.

Thanks so much for all your hard work. Small quilts are 2 for 1 hour, Surging or rolled hem on the receiving blankets 10 for 1 hour and hats, diaper shirts and booties are 10 for 1 hour.


