Positions for Quilt Show

- Show Chair This position is responsible for general coordination and success of the show.
- Admissions/Volunteers- This position is responsible for acquiring and assigning volunteers, coordinating and set up of Admissions/ Information table at the show. This position will coordinate the white glove volunteers to show quilts to the general public.
- **Door Prizes/Awards** This position is in charge of acquiring and distributing door prizes and entry awards. This includes coordinating announcers.
- **Hospitality** This position is to coordinate food and refreshment during the show along with drinks for volunteers and vendors for setup, during and takedown. Help Vendor Chair coordinating goody bag and lunch tickets for vendors.
- Judges/Awards This position is in charge of acquiring Judges, providing critique sheets, coordinate scoring to determine awards and acquire ribbons.
- **Mini Quilt Auction** This position is in charge of acquiring mini quilts from members, general coordination of volunteers and mini quilt bids/display.
- **Photography**-This position will take pictures of all entries for the CD and general pictures of the show.
- **Program and Ads** This position is responsible for acquiring sponsors, coordinating assembling program book, CD, posters and advertising the show.
- **Quilt Entries** This position is in charge of entries, layout (with help from Venue), setup, take down and coordination of volunteers that is needed.
- **Raffle Quilt** This position is in charge of the displaying and selling of raffle tickets and CD's at the show. They will need to coordinate volunteers to sell tickets and merchandise.
- **T-Shirt/Logo** This position is in charge of the design and ordering of shirts for the show.
- **Treasurer/Budget** This position is in charge of tracking expenses of the show.
- Venders- This position is in charge of coordinating vendors. This includes acquiring vendors, determining setup, goody bag, lunch tickets and providing contracts. This person needs to help vendors set up before the show. Need to acquire volunteers to take care of vendors during the show.
- **Venue-** This position will determine venue and coordinate drapes, and layout of rooms with input from Vendor and Quilt Entries. Needs to coordinate table setup/take-down for Vendors, Mini-quilts, Raffle Quilt and Admission tables.
