Retreat: Shawn Carr said the recent retreat was very successful with 26 members participating. There was a show and tell of quilt tops made at the retreat using jelly rolls.





*Small guilts are 2 for 1 hour *Surging or rolled hem on the receiving blankets 10 for 1 hour

*Hats, diaper shirts and booties are 10 for 1 hour

Please remember to bring all your Receiving Blankets, small quilts and hats back to our next meeting. Please make sure you return them in the white bag that you took them in along with the tag on the bag

Gift must be wrapped or decorative bagged with category noted on outside.


You do not need to sign up in advance, participation will occur at May Guild meeting.
