Love Thy Baby provides all the fabric so if your stash is short and you want volunteer hours please consider doing blankets for us. We provide all the fabric needed all you have to do is surge or a **rolled hem** on the 36 x 36 flannel. Small quilts 36 x 36 are completely put together all you have to do is do the quilting on top in the ditch or meandering.

*Small quilts are 2 for 1 hour

*Surging or rolled hem on the receiving blankets 10 for 1 hour

*Hats, diaper shirts and booties are 10 for 1 hour

Please remember to bring all your Receiving Blankets, small quilts and hats back to our next meeting. Please make sure you return them in the white bag that you took them in along with the tag on the bag

Show News

Remember when we talked about the show and I said start working on your show quilts?? Well.... START WORKING ON THOSE SHOW QUILTS LADIES!!!! We will need to try and have 45 quilt entries for this show and the show entry will open up on February 1st. It will be a first come first serve basis until we reach our quota for our guild. They are encouraging you not to make king size but queen size and smaller which will hang better and judge better. We hope to only have one entry per person but a second entry would be allowed only after we can't fill it up. We have started forming committees and I took "Quilt take in/sign out" and Linda took "Volunteers". That doesn't mean we are the only ones to work that area...just that we are the main point of contact and organizers. All the guilds will be working together in all areas of the show and expo.

We discussed a preview night with a special speaker as a fund raiser for the guilds. Yes you would have to buy a ticket for it as we would have a speaker and maybe a show & tell. The ticket sales would be divided amongst the guilds. We discussed maybe having an area where you could sell finished quilts but there are a lot of questions on that scenario so not definite on that idea. We are also working on a mini auction but have to ask for floor space for either a live auction type sale or a silent auction. And whatever we sell at our Guild booth is a way to raise money for the guild. So if we want to create some hand sewn items to sell we can as long as we are not in direct competition with the venders in the Expo area.

The main focus as a money maker is selling the tickets for the show for 12.00 each. They are 15.00 at the door. If you sign up as a volunteer for so many hours you get in free. If you sign up for classes, the more you enroll in the more you save. Carpooling is encouraged because if you have at least 3 in the car, the driver gets in free and the other 2 can split the parking fee of \$5.00. There are all kinds of ways to make money and save money here. But we must get the word out and encourage people to attend the Expo/ Quilt show. Especially the guilds that are not a part of the core group... which is most of Dallas County.

I have to tell you these are some hard working and knowledgeable ladies who are trying to get this adventure on its feet. It's not anyone's first rodeo and we all have a lot riding on the success of the show. Just the fact that it's going to be a yearly thing is a little daunting but very doable. The plan is to set some rules in place, see what works or doesn't work and then tweak the system for the next show. Eventually it could get settled enough that anyone could step in and run it on any given year.

We will keep you informed as new things happen. Meanwhile... get those sewing machines cranking out a winning quilt!!

Each year in May, a good friends of ours, Joe and Teresa Losole, open up their home to an organization called Defenders of Freedom. This organization offers our warriors a weekend of golf, food and friendship and this cookout is a part of that. Joe and Teresa cater a BBQ cookout in their backyard for the men and women who have served our country. Most of these people have been wounded or have mental health issues but some are from WWII, Korea and many from Viet Nam. He has a small band come and provide entertainment each year and they do this for free. He gets drinks and some of the food donated each year from restaurants and people's homes. Last year I was able to use some extra QOV quilts from the Houston Chapter and present some to a few of these men and women. They were thrilled with them. One man said his wife put it on their bed and he sees it each night and it makes him feel good. He says he really appreciates it a lot.

They arrive on a bus and unload in front of the house where they are greeted with hugs and smiles. The whole place is decorated with flags and red, white and blue. The band is playing and the smell of brisket and chickens on BBQ pits is in the air. There is laughter and smiles as they start to relax and mingle. It's a great thing this family does for these men who start out as strangers but leave as family friends. He has been doing this for about 6 or 7 years and it's all from his heart.

What I am asking for is if you have any Quilts of Valor in the works, could you maybe hurry and get them finished so I can present as many as possible again this year. I have 4 tops that I can get finished but I would welcome any that I can get. And since they are all from the Irving Guild, I would love for them to out shine the ones from Houston. You ladies make beautiful quilts with lots of thought put into them so I know the guys will really love them and fight over them. Last year there was good natured ribbing and if anyone set their quilt down and turned their back, someone would swoop in and grab it. Lots of wives were tasked with holding quilts that day!
