Donna awarded the winning light red ticket to Barbara Coughlin.



We provide all the fabric needed all you have to do is surge or a **rolled hem** on the 36 x 36 flannel. Small quilts 36 x 36 are completely put together all you have to do is do the quilting on top in the ditch or meandering.

*Small quilts are 2 for 1 hour

*Surging or rolled hem on the receiving blankets 10 for 1 hour

*Hats, diaper shirts and booties are 10 for 1 hour

Please remember to bring all your Receiving Blankets, small quilts and hats back to our next meeting. Please make sure you return them in the white bag that you took them in along with the tag on the bag

Quilt Show Update

We had our November meeting and got a few things cleared up. There is now an official entry form and category listing. It has all the rules and definitions for classifying your entry. We will be adding it to the website so you can read and download it from there. Read it over carefully as you decide where to enter your beautiful quilt. If you want to fill out the entry form just so you have everything figured out you can but ALL entries will need to be filled out and submitted on line. We saw a logo which will probably end up as a T-shirt design also. We talked about a Mini- Quilt auction as a fund raiser. It will need to be a really sharp mini quilt to stand out from all the other guilds and make people bid on it. We will have the "Buy it Now" option on these also.

As I said at the last meeting, IQG is the committee chairs for Quilt check in/ release and for the Volunteers for the show. That does not mean that this is the only area we will work in. All volunteers will work in conjunction with all the other guild volunteers. We will be one big happy family all working with the one goal of making this a success for years to come. We are all just laying the groundwork for future shows. This first show will hopefully show us where we need to improve our processes and where it all just clicked.

Here is what we know for sure:

North Texas Quilt Festival and Original Sewing and Quilt Expo:

Thurs., Fri., Sat., August 24, 25, 26, 2017

On Line registration: beginning of February 2017; ends May 1, 2017

Registration for Expo Classes: beginning March 2017

Quilt Check in: August 21, 4-8 p.m.

Quilt Pick Up: August 26, 6:30- 8 p.m.

Show set-up: Tues. to Wed, August 22 & 23, 8 am to 5 pm.

Special Event & Preview Night: Wednesday, August 23, 7pm.

Entries. Each guild has a limited amount of entries. First come first serve. Only the members of Bear Creek, Ft. Worth Modern, Ft. Worth Guild, Irving Guild, Arlington and Trinity Valley Guilds can enter their quilts.

Fund Raisers: Ticket sales, Mini Auction, Quilt sale booth (Maybe) and anything we do in our Guild Booth. Also the Preview Night ticket sales.

I will keep you informed as new details become available. We have to have entries and sell tickets. This is where we really need to step up to make this a success for our Guild. Thanks,

Irish Brown Bread

Preheat oven to 400 degrees.

3/4 cups all-purpose flour
1/2 cups stone ground whole-wheat flour
4 teaspoons baking soda
2 tablespoons dark brown sugar
1/2 cup wheat germ
1/2 cups wheat bran
1/4 cups steel-cut oats
2 teaspoons sea salt



1 quart plus 1/2 cup buttermilk at room temperature

In a large bowl mix all dry ingredients until well combined. Add buttermilk and stir until dry ingredients are evenly moist.

Divide dough equally between 2 greased loaf pans. (9 or 10 inches by 5 inches). Bake in middle of oven until golden and crusty, 50 minutes. Unmold and cool on a wire rack.

This recipe was in the newspaper submitted by Gail Monaghan. She suggests using King Arthur flour. Anne Lawrence kindly shared her recipe for the delicious Irish Brown Bread.
