
Congratulations to everyone with perfect attendance Dec. 2015 thru Nov. 2016! Hurrah!

- \*Small quilts are 2 for 1 hour
- \*Surging or rolled hem on the receiving blankets 10 for 1 hour
- \*Hats, diaper shirts and booties are 10 for 1 hour

Please remember to bring all your Receiving Blankets, small quilts and hats back to our next meeting. Please make sure you return them in the white bag that you took them in along with the tag on the bag



This is one of my grandmother's German butter cookie recipes.

I'm glad everyone liked it!

2 cup butter (softened)

1 1/2 cup sugar

3 cup flour

1 cup sesame seed

2 cup flake coconut

1/2 cup finely chopped almonds

In large bowl cream butter then gradually add sugar - continue beating until light and fluffy. Add flour and mix until just combined. Stir in coconut and almond just until mixed. Shape into long rolls 2 inch in diameter, wrap in wax paper and chill until firm. Preheat oven to 300 degrees. Cut roll into 1/2 inch slices and bake on ungreased cookie sheet for 30 minutes, or until lightly browned. Remove to wire rack to cool. Store in airtight container as these cookies will take on the flavor of other things they are stored with.
