Turn in your bag of <u>50 Receiving blankets or 8 Small Quilts</u> and get for an extra hour. Lassie does so many she would like to give anyone that turns in Receiving Blankets or Small Quilts a free hour.

Would you consider doing some small quilts and or Receiving blanks for us? Love Thy Baby provides all the fabric so if your stash is short and you want volunteer hours please consider doing blankets for us.

We provide all the fabric needed all you have to do is surge or a rolled hem on the 36×36 flannel. Small quilts 36×36 are completely put together all you have to do is do the quilting on top in the ditch or meandering.

*Small quilts are 2 for 1 hour

*Surging or rolled hem on the receiving blankets 10 for 1 hour *Hats, diaper shirts and booties are 10 for 1 hour

Please remember to bring all your Receiving Blankets, small quilts and hats back to our next meeting. Please make sure you return them in the white bag that you took them in along with the tag on the bag

The quilt show entry is closed and we ended up with 354!!! WOW!!

This is going to be a great show for people to come see. The vender list will be complete and available on line soon and the class sign-ups will be open by May 19. You need to check those out and see what all they are offering from the national level teachers. Now is the time to take advantage of what they have to offer while it's here locally.

Festival night : Guest Speaker- Meg Cox. A Brother sewing machine will be given away as a door prize to those in attendance. Big quilt show winners will be announced and celebrated. Tickets will be 15.00 each. IQG will be allotted 26 tickets to sell which will earn the guild 322.00 in income !! Another chance to make some money for the guild.

Volunteer sign up ! We need to average 26 volunteers a day. Which might be excessive sounding but not when you realize the areas we are covering. If you volunteer for set- up there is no parking fee since the event is not open yet. And you are earning admission to the show for a later date.

Here is the run down for what we think we will need in the way of volunteers for all areas. These numbers are for all the guilds to help supply the bodies. That is why it is important you put in a preference now if you need a sit-down job or prefer being an Angel.

EXPO- Class assistance, bag check - 30/day = 90 total

Festival Night – 4 total

Quilt Festival- Check In- 15 total

Set- Up – 40 - total Take Down – 40 total Quilt Angels – 15/day = 45 total Scribes – 3/judges/ shift = 15 total Ribbons – 8 total



Lisa Erlandson will be doing quilt appraisals on Thursday. She can also appraise your quilt that is hanging in the show or you can bring in a different one.

The lay-out committee will be having a meeting on June 3rd so it won't be long now. We are rapidly coming to the wire and almost to the fun part. It is really an easy process sharing the work like this. We only have to deal with one portion of the show and although it will be a mad dash to get it all organized at the end, it is so much easier and cheaper with this arrangement. I am hoping you will all see that it's worth the rewards in the end and continue to support the future shows as well as you have done this one. Thanks for all you have done and are doing to sell tickets and earn money for the guild. I will try to keep you all aware of what is happening behind the scenes and hopefully answer any questions you may have.
