Would you consider doing some small quilts and or Receiving blanks for us? Love Thy Baby provides all the fabric so if your stash is short and you want volunteer hours please consider doing blankets for us.

We provide all the fabric needed all you have to do is surge or a rolled hem on the 36×36 flannel. Small quilts 36×36 are completely put together all you have to do is do the quilting on top in the ditch or meandering.

Please remember to bring all your Receiving Blankets, small quilts and hats back to our next meeting. Please make sure you return them in the white bag that you took them in along with the tag on the bag

^{*}Small quilts are 2 for 1 hour

^{*}Surging or rolled hem on the receiving blankets 10 for 1 hour

^{*}Hats, diaper shirts and booties are 10 for 1 hour

DID YOU KNOW?

A **layer cake** is a collection of 10" squares. Approximately 2 \(^3\)4 yards of fabric are in a layer cake. Note that different manufacturers use different names.

A **charm pack** is a collection of 5" squares.

A mini charm pack is 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" pre-cuts. Usually 42 pieces.

A jelly roll has forty 2 ½" x 44" strips of fabric.

Honey Buns are not as available as they once were. If you can find them, they are $1 \frac{1}{2}$ x 44 strips. Using a $\frac{1}{4}$ seam allowance produces a 1" strip.

Dessert Rolls are "double" jelly rolls. They are 5" x 44" strips.

Honeycombs – fairly new and hexagon shaped. They measure 6" from point-to-point, $5\frac{1}{4}$ " horizontally.

Turnovers – these are triangles and not as common as other shapes. May be 10", 6" or 6 ½". Also called half square triangles.
