Would you consider doing some small Quilts, Receiving Blankets, Hats, Booties or Diaper Shirts for us?

Love Thy Baby provides all the fabric so if your stash is short and you want volunteer hours please consider helping us.

We provide all the fabric needed all you have to do is **surge** or a **rolled hem** on the 36×36 flannel. Small quilts 36×36 are completely put together all you have to do is do the **quilting** on top in the ditch or meandering.

- *Small quilts are 1 for 1 Point
- *Surging or rolled hem on the receiving blankets 10 for 2 Points
- *Hats, Diaper Shirts and Booties are 10 for 2 Points.

Please remember to bring all your Receiving Blankets, small Quilts and hats back to our next meeting. Please make sure you return them in the white bag that you took them in along with the tag on the bag and fill out the return slip.

Miss Seeton Quilts the Village

(2017) (Book 22 in the Miss Seeton series) A novel by Hamilton Crane

Miss Seeton returns! A new original (the first in almost 20 years) for this classic series of humorous cozy mysteries created by Heron Carvic.

It's practically a royal marriage! The highly eligible son of Miss Seeton's old friends Sir George and Lady Colveden has wed the daughter of a French count.

Miss Seeton lends her talents to the village scheme to create a quilted "Bayeux Tapestry" of local history, inspired by the wedding. But her intuitive sketches reveal a startlingly different perspective involving buried Nazi secrets, and links to the mysterious death of a diplomat and to a South American dictator....

Serene amidst every kind of skulduggery, this eccentric English spinster steps in where Scotland Yard stumbles, armed with nothing more than her sketchpad and umbrella!

Salted Caramel Buttercream Icing

Ingredients:

1/2 cup granulated sugar

4 Tablespoons water

2 teaspoons light corn syrup

1/2 cup cream

1 teaspoon vanilla

1 teaspoon lemon juice or vinegar

1 teaspoon salt

2lb powdered sugar

2 sticks butter, softened

Instructions:

- 1. Mix the water, corn syrup, and the granulated sugar together in a very small saucepan. Bring the water and sugar mixture to a boil over medium heat, but DO NOT STIR. Cook until the water and sugar mixture caramelizes into the beautiful golden brown color. It happens quickly once the sugar starts browning.
- 2. Remove the caramelized sugar syrup from heat, and mix in the cream. It mixes in more easily if the cream is at room temperature, but it can still work if you have cold cream--you just have to do it slowly.
- 3. Mix in the salt and the vinegar. Stir to combine and let caramel sauce cool completely.
- 4. Once the caramel sauce is completely cool, combine the softened butter, powdered sugar, and caramel together in a mixer and beat until smooth


