They would like Irving Quilt Guild to conduct a four-hour workshop open to about 200 families to do a make & take project. Suzanna is asking for suggestions on a Texas/Southwest themed project.

The Arts Center has also offered their Focus Gallery to hang about 20 quilts for display. The dates are June 16-July 8. They are also offering a covered table-top exhibit for displaying special quilts, such as Quilts of Valor, Angel Quilts. This dovetails nicely with the Expo which will be finished before this event takes place.

Just a quick reminder on size. The length and width on a small Angel Quilt equals 90" or better. A large is 120". Small is 4 points and large is 8. If you're close but not quite there add a border.

LOVE THY BABY... need to get your Volunteer hours done?

Love thy Baby Points have increased.

Would you consider doing some small Quilts, Receiving Blankets, Hats, Booties or Diaper Shirts for us?

Love Thy Baby provides all the fabric so if your stash is short and you want volunteer hours please consider helping us.

We provide all the fabric needed all you have to do is **surge** or a **rolled hem** on the 36×36 flannel. Small quilts 36×36 are completely put together all you have to do is do the **quilting** on top in the ditch or meandering.

- *Small quilts are 1 for 1 Point
- *Surging or rolled hem on the receiving blankets 10 for 2 Points
- *Hats, Diaper Shirts and Booties are 10 for 2 Points.

Please remember to bring all your Receiving Blankets, small Quilts and hats back to our next meeting. Please make sure you return them in the white bag that you took them in along with the tag on the bag and fill out the return slip.






Quilt of Valor Quilts Needed

People celebrate Christmas Day in many ways. In the days or even weeks before Christmas Day, many people decorate their homes and gardens with lights, Christmas trees and much more. It is common to organize a special meal, often consisting of turkey and a lot of other festive foods, for family or friends and exchange gifts with them. Children, in particular, often receive a lot of gifts from their parents and other relatives and the mythical figure Santa Claus. This has led to Christmas Day becoming an increasingly commercialized holiday, with a lot of families spending a large part of their income on gifts and food.

Many Sunday schools, churches and communities organize special events. These can include decorating the neighborhood or a shopping mall, putting up a Christmas tree and planning a Nativity display, concert or performance. A lot of plays and songs have a aspect of Christmas as a theme. Some groups arrange meals, shelter or charitable projects for people without a home or with very little money.

Quilt Show dates-June 7,8,9, 2018

Registration opens on- line on January 8th and closes March 5th.

Quilt check in is Monday June 4 from 12-4. Please note this is during the day instead of evening hours. If you work but have a quilt to turn in- we will help you or you can get someone to drop it off for you.

Pick up is Saturday June 9-5:45 to 7 pm after the show.


Basic rules are pretty much the same with just a few changes in the category descriptions or divisions.

Important things to remember:

We are accepting quilts made in the last 5 years...could have been in another show just not last year's show. That should help everyone enter a quilt.

Nothing larger than 96 wide. Very important because they will not fit on the poles we have.

Hanging sleeve of minimum 4 inches wide FINISHED. If you have a quilt longer than 90 inches you need to put the sleeve there or add a second sleeve at 90 inches to keep your quilt off the floor.



All of this info is on the guild website for you to print off and reference later if needed. If for some reason you can't figure something out, let us know so we can discuss it early enough to help you. We are here to help you any way we can.


