Love thy Baby Points have increased.

Would you consider doing some small Quilts, Receiving Blankets, Hats, Booties or Diaper Shirts for us?

Love Thy Baby provides all the fabric so if your stash is short and you want volunteer hours please consider helping us.

We provide all the fabric needed all you have to do is **surge** or a **rolled hem** on the  $36 \times 36$  flannel. Small quilts  $36 \times 36$  are completely put together all you have to do is do the **quilting** on top in the ditch or meandering.

- \*Small quilts are 1 for 1 Point
- \*Surging or rolled hem on the receiving blankets 10 for 2 Points
- \*Hats, Diaper Shirts and Booties are 10 for 2 Points.

Please remember to bring all your Receiving Blankets, small Quilts and hats back to our next meeting. Please make sure you return them in the white bag that you took them in along with the tag on the bag and fill out the return slip.

Many classes available for garment instruction, fabric dying techniques, hand embroidery and beading embellishment, notions, threads, and battings, make and take bags, cases, pouches, and totes. Some half day classes and many one-hour lectures!

Quilting classes available for improving your binding techniques, use of UFO's, learn about making table runners, wallhangings, small quilts and minis, use of templates for quilting designs, free motion quilting fillers, and even a block party exchange!

#### **Quilt Show Update**

We had a meeting on Sunday February 11<sup>th</sup>. That's when it dawned on everyone that the quilt entry deadline is right on top of us !! March 5<sup>th</sup> is the last day for quilt entries for the show. And at last count there had been only 10 people enter so far within all the guilds. We discussed the fact that in a lot of cases the picture is the hold up. So they said you can enter your quilt now as long as you send the picture to Jenn Haxton by March 17<sup>th</sup> it will be okay. Her e- mail is <a href="mailto:jshaxton@gmail.com">jshaxton@gmail.com</a> This can be a picture of blocks on the floor and as long as someone can figure out the pattern and the colors it will be accepted.

Another deadline is May 18<sup>th</sup> for Mini quilts for the auction. This is potentially a big way to make money for the guild so we need your entries. These can be embroidery blocks with sashing around them or a pieced mini quilt as long as it's not larger then 24 inches on any side. Sue Gray has agreed to be the guild point of contact for organizing the mini quilts for the show and getting them to the show for display. Please get with her to turn in your minis.

Festival Nite is Friday during the show. The guest speaker in Marianne Fons from Fons and Porter Magazine and tv quilt show. She will speak and have a show and tell. We only have 22 tickets to sell for us to get the money but if we do run out before you get yours, you can buy one on line at the website. Seating is very limited so buy yours early. There are door prizes galore and we heard something about "refreshments" being available for purchase. They said they want to allow more time for folks to get those and they are working on opening the doors an hour before show time to mix and mingle. The guild will make \$550.00 on these ticket sales.

Show tickets: We have 60 comp tickets where we get all the proceeds from their sale. That gives us \$600.00 profit. After those sell we can make \$5.00 per ticket for everything over the first 60. We need you to get those families to buy tickets to come see your show. Take them to work and sell them to the husbands for their wives or mothers. Take them to church or church groups and offer them there. Retirement homes that offer their tenants a bus trip excursion might be a great day trip for those ladies.

If you want to sign up for a class do it NOW in order to get what you want.

If you want to volunteer do it NOW in order to get that sit down job or the position you really want to work at.

Also, Linda and I need to find some people to start mentoring for taking over on the show committee. Every committee needs fresh blood and fresh ideas to make sure you are doing things the right way. We have been working hard to get each position figured out and running easily but fresh eyes are always welcome. Most of the ladies on the board have done this for 2 years and are ready to take a backseat role. Once you get familiar with the board, you can always volunteer for a different job for the show. Nothing says that IQG has to keep Volunteers or Take in/ Check out forever. Susan Holt has said she would like to start shadowing us with this show. I would love to see another lady step up and get involved. It's not as hard as you think and sharing the load with other guilds is much easier then doing it all yourself.

We need your 100% support for the show in order to make this a big money maker. If we don't do well we will have to go back to making Raffle Quilts to pay for our needs.
