Love Thy Baby provides all the fabric so if your stash is short and you want volunteer hours please consider doing blankets for us.

We provide all the fabric needed all you have to do is surge or a rolled hem on the 36×36 flannel. Small quilts 36×36 are completely put together all you have to do is do the quilting on top in the ditch or meandering.

*Small quilts are 1 for 1 Point

*Surging or rolled hem on the receiving blankets 10 for 2 Points

*Hats, diaper shirts and booties are 10 for 1 Point

Please remember to bring all your Receiving Blankets, small quilts and hats back to our next meeting. Please make sure you return them in the white bag that you took them in along with the tag on the bag

Allison Bayer gave a great program on Creative Backings. Basically you just look at what you have left after making the top and start working to fill the back. This can be a great place for orphan blocks, a strip of a different color, or whatever looks good on this separate palate. She had lots of samples of her own work to show us how she does it. Then we got to see how she does the magic binding — a technique that can add a lot of pizazz to a quilt for little additional effort. I believe I will be adding this binding to a few angel quilts to see how I like the finished piece. We even have a You Tube video to refer to if we have trouble remembering which fabric goes where!

There was no workshop in April because I was in my best friend's wedding on that day. I had to be out of town and no one else volunteered to open the JC Park small room that we had reserved. We don't have a workshop planned for May either, so if you have an idea how to constructively use this time please get in touch with me so we can get a meeting worked out.
