Hamburger Three Bean Soup

1 lb. Hamburger

1 pk. Ranch Dressing mix

2 cans of original rotel

2 cans Ranch Style Beans

1 pk. Taco seasoning

2 14.5 ozs. cans of Beef Broth

2 cans Kiddney Beans

2 cans Black Beans

*Small quilts are 1 for 1 Point

*Surging or rolled hem on the receiving blankets 10 for 2 Points

*Hats, diaper shirts and booties are 10 for 2 Point

Programs – June and July 2018

Our speaker for June was Nancy Smith who spoke on quilting books in children's literature. I was very curious about one of these books, "The Quilt Maker's Gift". I found that I have the quilt pattern book based on the story. The patterns are very doable, instructions are good, and color shots are wonderful. I'm sure I could find many of these patterns elsewhere, but I was enchanted by some of these. My favorite is the Fish Quilt. I may be making that one soon! Now I want to get the book itself to work along the storyline.

In July we have the privilege of having Beverly Ingram from Quilter's Dream. She will be talking about a new technique called 'picture piecing' designed by Cynthia England. The pattern we will be using is a state of Texas form overlaid by the state flag. There will be a kit available to make this pattern for \$11.00. There are other patterns that could be used by this designer. Please go to her web address of englanddesign.com if you think you would be more interested in one of these other patterns. The prices of all of her patterns range from \$10-\$14 each. Beverly will also have a supply of some of these other patterns with her.

For this workshop there will be a fee of \$10 plus \$10 for the pattern. If you wish to buy a kit from Beverly the fee for that is \$11. 
Material Woman
