Quilts of Valor Panel Challenge





We provide all the fabric needed all you have to do is surge or a rolled hem on the 36 x 36 flannel. Small quilts 36 x 36 are completely put together all you have to do is do the quilting on top in the ditch or meandering.

*Small quilts are 1 for 1 Point

*Surging or rolled hem on the receiving blankets 10 for 2 Points

*Hats, diaper shirts and booties are 10 for 2 Point

Please remember to bring all your Receiving Blankets, small quilts and hats back to our next meeting. Please make sure you return them in the white bag that you took them in along with the tag on the bag

Quilt Show update from January 5th meeting

F & W has been sold back to the original owners- Hoffman Media. Hopefully this will improve how the shows are run by them. They lost the lady who was the point of contact between us and F&W so we are waiting on a replacement.

A few took a tour of the Convention center to check out the new layout since they turned part of it in to a gaming center. Actually...if Sewing Expo keeps all the venders in the old area and gives us the other area, it looks like we might have more room and be able to keep all of our stuff in one area. The separate classrooms are gone making it one big ballroom. Plus, we could possible utilize some of the gaming area. So, we THINK that we could hang close to 350 quilts again. Still need to talk to Mark about his special exhibits and where those will be.

All classes will be in the Sheraton Hotel.

They are tweaking the rules and entries right now. Hopefully we will have those before the next meeting. Continue as we had last year but know they are accepting quilts up to 96 inches wide now. Any quilt made in the last 5 years that has not been entered before. If your quilt is longer than 90 inches in length, you must have a second sleeve on it at the 90-inch level on the back. No quilts will be allowed to drag or if it does, it will not be protected from people walking on it or any dirt on the floor.

We are going to put a lot of emphasis on Junior quilters this year. We are adding a Junior entries section in the show with reduced rates and categories. They are talking about trying to designate an area during the show for the kids to bring projects for help or we have pillowcase sets or something for a make and take project. We will need mentors for this area. We need to get more young people involved in quilting so we want to try this if we can. More details to come. Get your Grandkids making a small quilt to enter in the show!!

We threw around the possibility of each guild doing some gift baskets that will go into the Mini quilt auction area. These baskets would be filled with projects or irons and wool mats or fat quarters and patterns etc. They would be treated just like a mini with a buy it now price. We saw some in the Austin show and they were really nice but we would have to maybe get a couple of groups of ladies to work together to figure a theme for a basket and then gather the stuff to put it together and make it attractive to someone to pay big bucks for hopefully or it will go to auction. It could even be a BBQ theme or if you are lucky enough to know someone who would donate Ranger tickets or Cowboy tickets with parking passes you could make a great basket that sports fans would pick up. We would want to entice a Buy It Now person before it goes to open auction. We need your input on this idea... The reason I think we need to think outside the quilt box is because Mini auctions are very dated now. Yes, they bring in money but maybe we should try other things also.

They are also working on a one pay program where the buyer only goes to one person to pay regardless of which guild gets the money. That way we don't need a guild rep in that area all day long.

As far as we know, we will still have a guild booth for earning money. We think we have a booth coordinator for that. They will decide what will be happening in the booth to make money.

We are voting for skipping the Festival night this year because of the late-night event, driving for people, the costs and the fact that it's a pain. This will take away some of our profit line but also help keep our costs low.

For now, just get your quilts made. We are hoping to have the entry website up soon. I am feeling like we will still need to come up with around 30 quilts as our portion of the show, we still need some nice mini- quilts and once we figure out the theme for our booth, we will need your support there.

2019 Mystery Quilt Challenge - January

Irving Quilt Guild

Determine fabric selection:

In general, all fabrics (except Fabric 3) reads as a solid. Fabric 3 can be a print or it can also read as a Solid. Your choice.

Options on picking your fabric:

Complimentary – using Complimentary colors (ex: Blue/Orange, Purple/Yellow, Red/Green) Modern – Add gray with one of your favorite colors (ex: Blue/Gray (cowboy colors), Pink/Gray, Turquoise/gray).

Focus Fabric – Pick a focus fabric/print and pick colors to corresponds with it. Scrappy – Use your stash

Yardage (and label your fabric):

Fabric 1 – Dark Value (ex: black, Navy, Burgundy, Emerald, etc....)

Fabric 2 – Dark to Medium Value

Fabric 3 (Focus)— Dark to Med Value such as a print. Make sure the print is not too large within 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ "area.

Fabric 4 – Medium Value/Complimentary Color of Fabric 3

Fabric 5 – Light/Neutral Value (ex: white, beiges)

Inner Border – Dark / Medium Dark Value (Not calculated in overall yardage)

Outer Border – TBD (Not calculated in overall yardage) Can use Fabric 3 <u>Size and Yardage does not include borders</u>


Once you staple/glue fabric, you can start cutting out your Unit 1 and 2.

Fabric 4, cut 6 (12) - 6 ½" square




Instructions given are for Lap Size. Twin Size will be in parenthesis.

CHOCOLATE CAKE WITH CHERRY FROSTING

One chocolate cake mix (any kind). Mix as directed on box but add 1.5 teaspoon of vanilla and 1.5-2 cups of pecans. Cook as directed but for 5-10 minutes longer (until knife or toothpick comes out clean. Flip out onto cooling grid top side down. Cool 10-15 minutes. Cut in half down the center, flip bottom back in pan.

FROSTING

One large tub of cool whip or whipped heavy cream One can of cherry pie filling (I usually use two cans, one in the center and one on top and then cover with whipped topping but I only had one pie filling, so I mixed them together this time to make more frosting).

Fold these two together. Spread half onto bottom in the pan. Place top onto that and spread with remaining frosting.
