Simply Delicious Strawberry Cake

Ingredients

- 1 (18.25 oz) box white cake mix
- 1 (3 oz) box strawberry-flavored instant gelatin
- 1 (15 oz) package thawed and pureed, plus 1/4 cup puree for frosting frozen
- strawberries in syrup
- 4 large eggs
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 1/4 cup water
- 1/4 cup softened butter
- 1 (8 oz) package softened cream cheese
- 1/2 teaspoon strawberry extract
- 3 to 3 1/2 cups confectioner's sugar
- freshly sliced for garnish, optional strawberries

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 °F. Lightly grease 2 (9-inch) round cake pans. Bake about 22 mins.

In a large bowl, combine cake mix and gelatin. Add pureed (15 oz) strawberries, eggs, oil, and water; beat at medium speed with an electric mixer until smooth. Pour into prepared pans, and bake for 20 minutes, or until a wooden pick inserted in the center comes out clean.

Let cool in pans for 10 minutes. Remove from pans, and cool completely on wire racks.

For the frosting: In a large bowl, beat butter and cream cheese at medium speed with an electric mixer until creamy. Beat in 1/4 cup of strawberry puree and the strawberry extract. (The rest of the puree is leftover but can be used in smoothies or on ice cream for a delicious treat.) Gradually add confectioner's sugar, beating until smooth.

Spread frosting in between layers and on top and sides of cake. Garnish with sliced fresh strawberries, if desired.

*They now come in 15 oz. strawberries /sugar in a round container.



Tips from a Longarm Quilter:

- To prevent seams from coming apart on a pieced outer border, Stay Stitch (1/8" to 1/4") around the outside of your quilt.
- Sometimes, you "Can't Quilt it Out" and sometimes you can. Generally, if it doesn't lay flat on the floor, it's not going to lay flat on the longarm frame.

Angel Quilts

Love Thy Baby provides all the fabric so if your stash is short and you want volunteer hours please consider doing blankets for us.

We provide all the fabric needed all you have to do is surge or a rolled hem on the 36 x 36 flannel. Small quilts 36 x 36 are completely put together all you have to do is do the quilting on top in the ditch or meandering.

*Small quilts are 1 for 1 Point

*Surging or rolled hem on the receiving blankets 10 for 2 Points

*Hats, diaper shirts and booties are 10 for 2 Point

Please remember to bring all your Receiving Blankets, small quilts and hats back to our next meeting. Please make sure you return them in the white bag that you took them in along with the tag on the bag

2019 Mystery Quilt Challenge – February

Irving Quilt Guild by Susan Turk

<u>Unit 3</u> (label and put in ziplock bag) Instructions given for Lap Size. <u>Twin Size will be in parenthesis</u>.

Summary:

Make 24 (48) number of 4 patches using fabric 4 & 5 unfinished size should be 4 1/2"X 4 1/2"

Detail Instructions:

Select the size of your quilt and if you are using Fat Qtrs (FQ) or Yardage (do not do both FQ and Yardage)

Cutting Instructions:


Fabric	Lap Size		Twin Size		
	Fat Qtrs (22")	Yardage (42")	Fat Qtrs (22")	Yardage (42")	
Fabric 5	Cut 6 - 2 ½"Width of FQ	Cut 3 – 2 ½" WOF	Cut 12 – 2 ½" Width of FQ	Cut 6 - 2 ½" WOF	
Fabric 4	Cut 6 - 2 ½"Width of FQ	Cut 3 – 2 ½" WOF	Cut 12 – 2 ½" Width of FQ	Cut 6 - 2 ½" WOF	

- Sew each strip of Fabric 5 with each strip of Fabric 4 strip lengthwise for all strip sets.

- Press seam allowance towards Fabric 4 (away from light fabric).

- Sub cut these strip sets in 2 ½" segments. Each segment should measure 2 ½" X 4 ½".
- Arrange two segments, one flipped around so that like colors are diagonal from each other. Sew together, butting seams for a perfect match.



Press seam allowance either way. The resulting four patch unit should measure 4 ½" x 4 ½".
You can reduce bulk by fanning out seam allowance when you press four patches.

<u>**Tip:</u>** After sewing all the Fabric 5s with Fabric 4s on the long edge and pressing, you can put two long units right sides together where Fabric 5 faces Fabric 4 and then sub cut the 2 units together. The pair pieces will be ready to sew to make 4 patches</u>
