Halloween is not an official holiday. Government offices and businesses are open as usual and public transit services run

If they are wearing dark costumes or masks, they may be less easy to see than normal. They may also be excited and dart out unexpectedly from between vehicles or behind bushes

Carol Cook talked about the 2020 show. They will be introducing a Theme Category. Restructuring the mini quilts, they must be judgeable and it will be a silent auction with a buy it now price. There is also a children's category that we need to get more entries for.

Cynthia Gladden broke down the money made at the quilt show, the total being about \$4700.

Susan Holt recognized all the workers from the show.Evelyn Banks talked about Blue Christmas coming up in November.

Angel quilts and regular quilts and quilts of valor were shown.

Lemon Cake

One lemon cake mix

3 jars of Kroger's private collection lemon filling(not Dickerson's lemon curd but it might work). It's usually on the bottom rack in small jars Blue berries (I used a large box) Cool whip

Bake cake as directed. Let cool. Slice long ways to make a top and bottom. Place bottom back in pan. Spread 1.5-2 jars of lemon filling over bottom. Pour blueberries evenly over filling. Place top of cake over berries. Spread rest of lemon filling over top. Spread cool whip over filling. Pour rest of blueberries over top. I piped some of the filling around edges but you don't have to do this.

Jalapeno Creamed Corn

1 - 8 oz package of cream cheese

1/4 cup butter

2 - 14 oz cans whole kernel corn (drained)

1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese

1/4 cup diced jalapeno chile peppers

Melt cream cheese and butter together in a saucepan over medium heat; add corn, 3/4 cup cheese and pepper until mixed up. Dump to a casserole pan and add more cheese on the top. Put in oven at 350 for about 15-20 minutes.

Beat 4 egg whites until frothy. Add ½ cup granulated sugar and mix well. Add 1 tsp. vanilla (optional) Add 1 bag (~14 oz.) shredded coconut Toss until evenly coated.



Drop by spoonful on parchment-lined baking sheet. Bake for 15-20 min. until golden on edges.

Let cool before removing from sheet.

2019 Mystery Quilt Challenge – September



Summary:

Assemble each Unit 4 and Fabric 5. Make a total of 24 (48) units.

Detail Instructions:

- Fabric 5 Cut 24 (48) 2 ½" X 6 ½"
- Unit 4
- Assemble the unit like diagram (sew ¼" seam):
