Love Thy Baby provides all the fabric so if your stash is short and you want volunteer hours please consider doing blankets for us.

We provide all the fabric needed all you have to do is surge or a rolled hem on the 36×36 flannel. Small quilts 36×36 are completely put together all you have to do is do the quilting on top in the ditch or meandering.

*Small quilts are 1 for 1 Point

*Surging or rolled hem on the receiving blankets 10 for 2 Points

*Hats, diaper shirts and booties are 10 for 2 Point

Please remember to bring all your Receiving Blankets, small quilts and hats back to our next meeting. Please make sure you return them in the white bag that you took them in along with the tag on the bag

2020 Retreat

We will have two Guild retreats for 2020, the Spring at Compass Centre March 5-8 and the Fall at a new location called Red Boot Retreat October 22-25. I will start collecting money for the Spring Retreat in December. If there are any food allergies, please let me know. The fall retreat will be at a new location called Red Boot Retreat. It is located North/West of Hillsboro. There is a max of 32 and minimum of 24 required. The bedrooms range from 2, 3 or 4 beds and there are 6 full baths and 2 half bathrooms. There will be a massage therapist if you want one. The workstation has 2 tables with adjustable legs and are the hard tops (not plastic) where your machine will not bounce when you sew. Your station also includes a cutting mat and a high-powered lamp with a dimmer. Centralized iron stations will be available. The eating area is next to the sewing area where Tea and Coffee are available. The local quilt shops are located in Whitney. This venue requires a deposit and money ahead of time, so payment must be made to the guild or you will not be able to attend, no exceptions. More Retreats!

A Christmas Gathering

(Book 17 in the Christmas series) A novel by Anne Perry

A festive house party takes a sinister turn...

Victor Narraway and his wife, Lady Vespasia, are invited to spend Christmas at Cavendish Hall with a gathering of old acquaintances, but it is not the quiet, rather stiff house party they had expected. While there, Victor must undertake his final mission for Special Branch, reminiscent of another one in the past, at which he had tragically failed.

When disaster strikes and one of the guests is left for dead, Victor fears that history is repeating itself. But which of them is intent on murder? And can Victor accept that he is not to blame...?

A Christmas Gathering is the gripping new festive mystery from the pen of Anne Perry, the master of Victorian crime.

48 Hour Class – January 18, 2020, location to be determined.

The class will be instructed by Nancy Bowen from Quilter's Dream and food will be provided. Doors will be open at 8:00am and class will start at 9:00am. Location to be determined. The name of the quilt is "Falling Stars" and the book is called "Scrap-Basket Bounty" by Kim Brackett and costs \$25.99 plus tax. If you order the book through the Guild, the Guild will pay \$10 towards the book. According to the instructor, not everyone needs a book and can be shared for each group of tables. Contact Donna Reid or Susan Turk (ASAP) if you want to order a book and you were not at the meeting or failed to request a book from Susan.

Cutting Instructions from Nancy

Fabric – The pattern in the book is for a quilt 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 64 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". I added another column of stars to make it 64 $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 64 $\frac{1}{2}$ " – for this size, the fabric requirements are listed below. Kim Brackett has you cut the squares for the half-sq triangles 1/8" bigger than you need and then trims down the half-sq triangles after they're sewn. Requirements for the smaller size quilt are in parenthesis.

For the larger size –

4 yards total of assorted lights (3 yds) 2 2/3 yds total of assorted darks (2 yds)

From the assorted lights, cut a total of: 64 Squares, 4 ½" X 4 ½" (48) 265 squares, 3" X 3" (192) 128 squares 2 ½" X 2 ½" (96)

From the assorted darks, cut a total of: 256 squares, 3" X 3" (192) 128 squares, 2 ½" X 2 ½" (96)

For the larger size, we will be making a total of 64 (48) blocks.



For the larger size, we will be making 512 (384) half-sq triangles using the 3" light and dark sq.

We'll be making 128 (96) of one unit for the block, and 64 (48) of a different unit.

What to bring!

Bring your sewing machine, scissors, mat, rotary cutter, ruler, pins, etc. If you have precut your fabric, there is very little cutting to do – just separating and trimming the half-sq triangles

Tips For Needle - turn Applique

Clip inside curves and points to within a thread of the marked lines, making clips closer together in tightly curved areas. Small, sharp embroidery scissors are great for clipping inner curves. Don't clip curves until you have stitched to within about 1" of the area. Try to make your clips on the bias grain of the seam allowance, which means your clips often will be on the diagonal rather than perpendicular to the marked lines. Directional clipping prevents fabric from raveling while you're working with the edges.

Mystery Quilt - Show and Tell

I want to send out a big Thank You to all the ladies who participated in the 2019 Mystery Quilt. I know that Shawn says, "She thought it up", but the truth is, I saw pictures and figured it out. The 2020 Mystery Quilt will come out around February and will probably only last 6 months. Here are some pictures from the Christmas Party.
