
National Watermelon Day


Please don't limit your consumption of watermelon to just this month. Stores carry watermelon twelve months of the year.



Press seams.

Press seams closed to set the threads in place, then press from the back of the patchwork, and finally flip it over and press from the front side. Remember not to move the iron back and forth with pressure as that will distort and stretch fabric.

Expo signs, & Ambassadors that roam looking needs. I can help if you are interested.


I am trying to get the Signup Genius to volunteer for other jobs like putting up quilts, t-shirt sales,

We provide all the fabric needed all you have to do is surge or a rolled hem on the 36 x 36 flannel. Small quilts 36 x 36 are completely put together all you have to do is do the quilting on top in the ditch or meandering.

- *Small quilts are 1 for 1 Point
- *Surging or rolled hem on the receiving blankets 10 for 2 Points
- *Hats, diaper shirts and booties are 10 for 2 Point

Please remember to bring all your Receiving Blankets, small quilts and hats back to our next meeting. Please make sure you return them in the white bag that you took them in along with the tag on the bag

Cherry Jubilee

Crust:

1 1/2 cup Flour

1 1/2 stick of margarine + 2 tbsps.

2 tbsps. sugar

3/4 cup chopped pecans

Cut flour & margarine- add sugar and pecans.

Press into bottom of oblong pan & bake at 350 for 20 minutes. Let cool.

Filling:

At low speed of mixer mix:

8 oz of cream cheese (room temp)

1 Lg. Cool Whip (warm)

2 cups confectioners sugar

Pour over cooled crust. Top with Cherry Pie filling and chill for 3 - 4 hours.

Show Meeting Update: 7/15/2021

The day is fast approaching, and we are still light on our ticket sales. We were asked to sell 100 tickets and have only sold 37. If you need a ticket for a family member or for church groups please let me know. These sales are money in our bank. If you wait and buy them at the door it's money in Expo's bank. I will go over the items we covered in the meeting:

- 1. Junior Division entries are up to around 20 so far. This a good because it gets kids involved in the sewing.
- 2. Mini- Auction- entry numbers are down. We had room for 180 quilts but only 158 were turned in. The chances of making much money has been greatly reduced for us.
- 3. Use the Sign-Up Genius to volunteer for Set-up/ Take-down or any other positions like classroom assistant, Judge scribes or whatever looks interesting. Remember...if you work a shift, you can visit the show for free that day. If you sign up for class assistant, you can learn what everyone else is learning also. Here is the link:

Vender and Booth setup can start at 8:00am on Wednesday.

- 4. Show volunteers will check in at the Information Booth. If you sign up for Expo volunteer positions you will check in at their Check in station.
- 5. As you view the show quilts, keep in mind that we need to vote on the Irving Guild's Galla Award quilt. Pick you favorite from only the Irving Quilt Guild's entries and we will count the votes at the next meeting and award the ribbon. This is not about show ribbon winners but about the quilt you like the best.
- 6. The show is booked solid as far as venders go. All the shows that Expo is sponsoring in other cities have been well received and busy. They are hoping for a great turn-out in Dallas as well. This is good news and we want to make it a great time for all the visitors.
- 7. Sunday quilt turn in from 1 to 5 on August 15th. Free parking for this.
- 8. Quilt pickup on Saturday August 21st...Free parking AFTER 4:00 PM only.

That's all I have for now. If you have questions let me know.

One more thing...put a sleeve on your quilts...Cover your label by pinning a piece of scrap fabric over it with SAFETY PINS PLEASE. Read all the instructions of entering a quilt in the show to help speed up the process during take in and hanging.
