IRVING QUILT GUILD GENERAL MEETING MINUTES



Date: June 16, 2022

Meeting called to order at 7:03 p.m. by Bonnie Sloan for Alene Winn who was out of town. ⊨veryone was enjoying a wonderful buffet of member-cooked items and ham and cupcakes provided by Susan Holt. A new member joined in, Donna Herna, who has entered 1 quilt in the Show.

<u>Quilt Show/Expo T-shirts</u>: Carol Cook announced that she is taking orders at the meeting for T-shirts, \$18 each, tonight only. They will be available at the Show for \$20.

Other Quilt Show/Expo Updates:

Volunteers: Susan Holt urged everyone to go to the Expo website and volunteer , <u>https://www.sewingexpo.com/Events/Dallas-TX/Volunteer</u>. Classroom Assistants is the area where volunteers are badly needed right now. The Guild will also need volunteers for hanging and taking down quilts, bag check and the Guild Store. There is no sign-up yet for those areas. She and Carol Cook stressed that if you volunteer 4 total hours for any Expo position, you will receive a free pass to the Show. Guild hours do not count toward the free pass.

Mini quilts: Jerry Bowen is the contact person for any mini quilts. Anyone wanting to enter a mini quilt needs to register it on the Expo website, print out the entry, put it on the back of the quilt and give the quilt to Jerry. You can drop it by her house or she will be glad to meet the person at a designated place. Deadline is June 30th.

Tickets: The Guild will a certain amount to sell and keep for Guild income. Susan Turk volunteered to be the contact person.

Quilt turn-in: Turn-in day is Sunday, August 14th. Suzanna Fox volunteered to pick up and take in any entered quilts for people who cannot make this date.

June Board Meeting Minutes: Ernestine Chipman started off by asking for any changes to the minutes for the April and May General Meetings. Hearing none, these minutes were approved as published in the May and June Guild newsletters. Then she gave a brief summary of the board meeting held on June 9th. Most of the meeting was devoted to the Quilt Show/Expo (see other areas of the General Meeting notes for more details). Also discussed—the June meeting & workshop, the July meeting & workshop, the City's Volunteer Fair, and Fall Retreat—which are covered by announcements in these General Meeting Notes and this newsletter. Other items not announced at this General meeting: *Finances*: Jerry Bowen started off the meeting by announcing that she had sent all the board members a copy of the latest approved budget earlier in the week which has May 2022 figures. The latest payments were to the Church and for quilting points. Finances are in good shape right now. *Guild Booth*: Donna Reid reported that the booth will have non-auction quality minis and Christmas ornaments. Please let her know if you have any additional ideas. *June Meeting*: Susan Holt will send out an email reminder to members on what food to bring and their favorite drink. *August board meeting*: The Board decided to hold this meeting the same day as the General Meeting, but at 6 p.m. Suzanna will put a note about this in the July and August newsletters.

Sunshine and Shadows: Connie Angeles had nothing to report.

Photo scrapbook: Nancy Norris brought the Guild's archive from 2007 to the meeting.

<u>August Volunteer Fair</u>: Susanna Fox reminded everyone that the City of Irving's Volunteer Fair will be held at the Irving Arts Center on August 6th from 2-4 p.m. Two people are needed to walk around with patriot quilt blocks to obtain signatures. Please contact Suzanna if interested. Cynthia Gladden volunteered.

GENERAL MEETING MINUTES continued

<u>June workshop</u>: Donna Reid reminded everyone that there will be a workshop on Saturday, June 18th, from 1-5 p.m. at the Garden & Arts Center. Attendees will be making things to sell at the Guild store during the Show. Attendees will need to bring their sewing machines, favorite tools, snacks and drinks (no lunch served). They can bring the store projects that they are already working on, but Donna will also have some additional kits for attendees to work on. She showed some examples.

<u>Fall Retreat</u>: Sue Gray announced that she will start taking money in July for the Fall Retreat at Red Boot on October 13-16th. Price will be the same--\$295.

July meeting/"Christmas in July" workshop: Bonnie announced that she had examples of what will be made at the "Christmas in July" workshop on July 23rd and the list of fabric needed for each item. Please sign up if you plan to attend.

<u>Special announcement regarding Church door</u>: Susan Holt proposed that members approve an Oakview staff recommendation that Guild members enter through the doors located just west of where we enter now, for security reasons. Members approved.

<u>Show-and-Tell/Angel Quilts</u>: There were many Angel quilts shown as well as a Tumbler block quilt by Carol Cook. Pansy Shehee won 4 Angel Quilt points. Donna Reid announced that all the names entered this month would be added to all the names entered in July for a drawing to win a book donated by Christy Wilson—*Fat Quarter Baby*.

Sue Hyde and Thenia Haynie awarded door prizes and then, Bonnie adjourned the meeting at 8:20 pm.

Sweet blueberry biscuit

*ingredients +

for biscuits

°2 cups flour
°1 cup cold milk
°Half a cup of sugar
°5 tablespoons butter (cold or frozen)
°4 teaspoons baking powder
°1 teaspoon salt
°3 ounces fresh or dried blueberries
+to glaze

°1 cup powdered sugar °Half a cup of water °1 teaspoon vanilla °Half a teaspoon of lemon juice

*How to make sweet raspberry biscuits

Heat the oven to 450 degrees Fahrenheit. In a large bowl, add salt, sugar, flour and baking powder and mix. Add cold milk and berries to the dry ingredients and mix. (Before you start baking the cookies, you need to put one piece of butter in the freezer for about an hour.) Remove the butter from the freezer and break it into pieces. Distribute the frozen powder pieces evenly over the cookie dough. Fold the raspberry biscuit dough and knead it.

Repeat until the frozen butter pieces are evenly distributed throughout the dough. Lay or turn it on a floured surface and roll it out about 1/4 to 1/8 inch thick. Using a cookie cutter, cut about 6 cookies from the dough. Bake the cookies for about 7 to 12 minutes.

Did you know that most <u>quilt pattern designers</u> include skill-level requirements for their patterns? This info is extremely helpful when you're shopping around for your first or next quilt pattern. If you cannot find that information, try sending a message to the pattern designer or asking an experienced quilting friend to help you with your selection.



Pineapple Side Dish

This recipe goes great with a ham dinner. I made the recipe in an 8×8 pan. This recipe can be doubled and baked in a 9×13 pan.

1 20 oz. can of pineapple chunks, <u>partially</u> drained

1/3 cup sugar

1 cup shredded cheddar cheese

- 2 little stacks of Ritz Crackers, crushed
- 1/2 stick butter, melted

Spray the pan with Pam. Layer the ingredients in this order:

Pineapple with liquid, sugar, cheese, Ritz crackers. Drizzle the melted butter over it all.

Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes.

FRITO PIE CASSEROLE

- 1 pound Ground Beef
- 1 small Onion finely chopped
- 1 packet Taco Seasoning + water on packet
- 1 15 ounce can Kidney Beans drained and rinsed
- 1 cup Corn Kernels frozen is best
- 1 can 15oz Enchilada Sauce
- 1 10.25 oz bag Fritos
- 2 cups Sharp Shredded Cheddar Cheese
- Various toppings for serving:
- Green onions
- Lettuce
- Black olives
- Avocado
- Sour Cream

Instructions

Preheat oven to 350° F. Spread 3/4 of the bag of Fritos in the bottom of a 9×13 -inch baking dish. In a large skillet brown ground beef and onion until fully cooked and onions are soft.

- Mix in taco seasoning water until well blended. Cook until thickened.
- Add enchilada sauce, beans and corn. Mix until everything is well combined.

Pour over Fritos and spread into an even layer. Sprinkle the cheese over the beef mixture.

- Bake for 15-20 minutes until the cheese is melted and bubbly.
- Serve topped with additional Fritos and your favorite taco toppings.


