


May workshop-Barn quilt with Deborah Kay Cost \$40 due April meeting or mail to

I received a post on Facebook the other day. It's about a Random Act of kindness kind of thing.... and boy couldn't we all use it right now? The article is below if any of you are interested. I plan to make a few of these and place them in Rest stops when we go on our road trip in June.



This is the Original Heart. It was Approximately 3.5".

Would you like to create handmade quilted hearts to participate in this project? The original heart is the photo above. The IFAQH Hearts are made of fabric, generally the size of your palm, and can be any shape of heart you choose. Most have a layer of batting or fiberfill and you can embellish with buttons, sequins, ribbon, etc. Have fun with your creative process!

After creating your hearts, print and attach the following tag: LINK TO <u>IFAQH PRINTABLE TAG</u>. (Free, for personal printing)

If you cannot print the tag, please hand write only the following information:

I Need A Home www.ifaqh.com #IFAQH I Found A Quilted Heart

*Do not add any other words to the tags or to the hearts. Embellishments should not have text. Tags should be plain text, without images.

Now that your heart is tagged, it is time to be placed in a public place to be found by a random stranger. Here are some of the rules:

- Do not hand, give or gift hearts to people. (Hearts need to be "found.")
- Do not leave hearts on personal or private property, such as a front porch, vehicle, door, bicycle, mailbox, gate, little libraries, etc. (Not public)
- Do not leave hearts in a cluster, like a giving tree. (Not random)
- Do not leave hearts in places that are not public: hotel rooms, work desk, break rooms, office, private retreat, etc. (Not public)
- Do not leave hearts inside any kind of retail store or on retail displays. (Can be mistaken for merchandise.)
- Do not leave hearts in airports. (Homeland security does not approve!)
- Do not leave hearts in National Parks, Wilderness, Forests, Monuments, Bureau of Land Managements, or other Federal Public Lands areas. (Federal Regulation Title 36, 2.22 (a))
- Do not leave hearts in bathrooms, restrooms, washrooms, etc. (Unsanitary)
- Do not leave in places where they may be thrown away by staff. (Super Sad)

Examples of good places to sow hearts: A local park, hiking trail, highway rest stop, community center, outdoor shopping center, town square, foyer of public place, community bulletin board, beach, nature trail, museum, tourist attraction, trees, bushes and fences in downtown areas, etc. Be imaginative and creative when looking for just the right public place to sow a heart and have fun! 

We had a month off from the guild meeting but not from sewing. I hope you took a little time to work on Angel Quilts. Bring them to the April meeting so we can see them.

Thank you everyone for all your beautiful quilts.

The second Thursday March 9th at 10:00 Thread Pickers will be sewing Angel Quilts from Tumblers. We have the tumblers, and you have the machine. Come join us and work on your own quilt or work with someone.

Remember the small quilts are worth 4 points for piecing and 3 points to the quilter. If you do both you receive both. The size is a minimum of 90 inches. One length plus one width. The large quilt is worth 8 points for the piercer and 6 for the quilter. If you do both you earn both. The size is minimum 120".


The quilt must have the top, batting and backing. It must be quilted not tied. There cannot be any buttons or bows attached to the quilt because children receive them.

Always remember to write your name on the lite red paper. Sarah Schacht won 4 points at the February meeting. Her Light Red ticket was randomly drawn by Alene but I believe it's the power of the Hawaiian shirts.

Wash your hands. Clean hands are good for our fabric as well

Quilt Show 2023 – "Soaring to New Heights"

The show is starting to speed up as time is flying by. The on-line entry is now active so get your thoughts together and grab a picture of your quilt (whether finished or not – it just needs to be identifiable to the entry people if we need to look for it) and get it entered. This year we have a new category for Wool quilts if you happen to be a "woolie". All quilts need to be made in the last 5 years and make sure you enter in the appropriate category of either Artisan or Master. There are instructions on line and category descriptions. If you are still not sure then ask me.

There has been some confusion about our quilters who enter quilts as an Artisan instead of Master. If you are someone who quilts for people and takes in money for that job (whether you claim it on taxes or not- no judgement here on that...you go girls !!) then you need to enter as a Master not an Artisan. Doesn't matter if you have won ribbons or not, you are still making money on your talent so it's not fair to a beginner Artisan to compete against that. That is something that will be checked by each Guild as they know who their local quilters are.

The entry deadline is June 1st. But on May 1st the entries open up to any non-Guild member from the outside. So if you want to guarantee a spot get yours in early.

We will be needing Mini Auction items also. That can be a purse, bag, tablerunner or mini quilt. Nothing over 24 inches on any side for quilts and everything must be able to hang for display. I think Linda Scott will have more info if you need it.

As our only fundraiser we really need everyone's help and participation in the show. We will be selling tickets and t-shirts soon so get ready to start pushing the show for real. Time is going to start flying.


