The exhibit will start on Sunday, September 17th, and will end on Sunday, January 7th—both dates approved by the Guild's Board and the Museum's staff. The Museum staff recommended the extension of the exhibit through the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays because they have noticed that Museum attendance is higher at those times. Misty's Book Nook

Remarkably Bright Creatures Shelby Van Pelt Contemporary Fiction/ Mystery



Widely considered one of the best books of 2022 if you are willing to suspend belief a little.

My favorite book of this year so far.

After Tova Sullivan's husband died, she began working the night shift at the Sowell Bay Aquarium, mopping floors and tidying up. Keeping busy has always helped her cope, which she's been doing since her eighteen-year-old son, Erik, mysteriously vanished on a boat in Puget Sound over thirty years ago.

Tova becomes acquainted with curmudgeonly Marcellus, a giant Pacific octopus living at the aquarium. Marcellus knows more than anyone can imagine but wouldn't dream of lifting one of his eight arms for his human captors—until he forms a remarkable friendship with Tova.

Ever the detective, Marcellus deduces what happened the night Tova's son disappeared. And now Marcellus must use every trick his old invertebrate body can muster to unearth the truth for her before it's too late.

Shelby Van Pelt's debut novel is a gentle reminder that sometimes taking a hard look at the past can help uncover a future that once felt impossible.

GEORGIA PEACH COBBLER

6-8 fresh peaches, peeled and sliced

1 stick unsalted butter, melted

1 cup flour

1 cup sugar

1 cup brown sugar

1 tablespoon baking powder

½ teaspoon salt

1 cup milk

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Juice from ½ lemon

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1 Preheat oven to 375°F.
- 2 Pour melted butter into center of 9×13-inch baking dish, do not spread butter around pan.
- 3 In a separate bowl, combine flour, 1 cup sugar, salt, and baking powder. Slowly pour in milk and vanilla extract and stir to combine. Pour batter over butter, but do not stir.
- 4 Add brown sugar, peach slices, and lemon juice to a saucepan on high heat. Stir frequently until sugar is completely melted and peaches have released their juices.
- 5 Pour peaches over top of batter. Do not stir.
- 6 Bake for 40-45 minutes or until top of cobbler is a golden in color.
- 7 Serve warm or cold, or with a scoop of ice cream. Enjoy!
