IRVING QUILT GUILD GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Date: May 18, 2023

Vice President Susan Holt called the meeting to order at 6:50 p.m. There were a lot of items to cover.

New Member: The meeting began with an introduction of a new member who joined during this meeting—Jill Hudgens.

Sunshine & Shadows: Jackie Wagner was not present to make this report due to a knee injury. Susan Holt reported for her instead. Suzanna Fox is out of town to celebrate a family graduation. Alene Winn had 3 surgeries during her 17-day hospital stay at Baylor but is home now. When Susan called her, she was anxious to get all of this over with. She is not allowed to stand or walk yet so call or send a card. Her husband, Miller, and daughter are taking good care of her.

Birthdays: Members sang “Happy Birthday” to Ginny North and Susan Turk.

President’s quilt: Ginny North announced that she still has a few blocks left if any member would like to make a block for this quilt. She would like to receive the finished blocks as soon as possible so she has time to assemble them into a quilt.

Retreats: Ginny North announced that she needs to start collecting money for the Fall Red Boot retreat at the July meeting. The September meeting will be the last meeting that she will accept payment. Red Boot requires full payment 30 days in advance. The Fall Retreat is *October 12-15*. She also announced that the *Spring Retreat will be held at Sunset Retreat and Quilt Shop* instead of Compass on *April 4-7, 2024*, instead of March. Sunset was selected because it has more amenities and the timing, because it does not conflict with either Spring breaks or the Dallas quilt show. She apologized to the Bear Creek members because the timing would run into their retreat. She will start collecting payments for Sunset in December, with last payments taken at the February General meeting.

Board and General Meeting Minutes: Ernestine Chipman reported on the Board Meeting and General Meeting Minutes from April—there were none to approve because she did not send her documents to Judy Poole by the April newsletter deadline to be published in the May newsletter. The April Minutes will be published in the June newsletter.

25th Anniversary Exhibit: Ernestine updated the membership regarding the Irving Archives & Museum exhibit for the Guild. (*SEE ALSO: SPECIAL ARTICLE LATER IN THIS NEWSLETTER WITH MORE SPECIFICS*). The Director of the Museum and her staff at Irving Archives and Museum have created a “Fall rack card”—an advertisement/flyer which they will distribute to hotels, travel centers, and around town—which the Exhibit committee has seen and approved. It really makes the Guild look great. **WHAT THE COMMITTEE NEEDS NOW:** Members who want to enter their **quilt (s), sewing machines, and/or notions in this exhibit, should contact Sue Gray, Susan Holt, or Ernestine Chipman**. The exhibit will open on Sunday, September 17th, and close on Sunday, January 7, 2024.

25th Anniversary Party: Shawn Carr, Celebration Party Committee Chair, reminded everyone about the date and time of the Anniversary luncheon: **Saturday, September 23rd, 1-3 p.m., Brazilian Steak House**. There will not be a speaker. She and her committee—Gayle Henegar, Susan Turk, Deborah Kay, and Evelyn Banks--will send out invitations to all current and charter members.

May and June Workshops: Susan Holt announced that the May workshop did not make because no one paid for the class in advance. Payment for all future workshops needs to be paid a month in advance. Please pay at tonight’s meeting or send a check for \$30 to Jerry Bowen before June 17th, the day of the June workshop, “Jelly Roll Tulips”. Deborah Kay, the instructor, showed a sample of the completed quilt. It will be held from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. in the same Holy Family Catholic meeting room, as used for the Guild’s General Meetings. *See article in another section of this newsletter for more details.*

June Program: This is a potluck dinner/no program meeting. Gail Henegar, Hospitality, passed around a sign-up list for items to bring. Please contact her if you would like to bring anything. Susan Holt asked members to bring Summertime-themed quilts for Show-and-Tell.

QUILT SHOW UPDATES:

Quilt Show Booth: Shawn Carr thanked everyone who has contributed items for the Booth. She has 4 tubs of them in her bedroom. She and her committee will start pricing them soon. There is still time if you want to help. Please call or email her. She has an electronics cord wrapping pattern that she could share. The Booth will also have a small raffle basket with the theme of “Trip around Texas”. It will contain 15 yards of fabric, a tote bag, and other travel items. She would love any travel-sized items donated.

Show T-shirts and Tickets: Judy Poole announced that the May General Meeting is the last time that she can take T-shirt orders. She has to turn in the money this coming Sunday. The Guild gets all the proceeds minus the cost of the shirts. It receives 100% of the Show tickets that she is selling tonight. They are \$12/each (\$15, at the door). She will also be selling them at the June meeting.

GENERAL MEETING MINUTES CONTUNED

Guild Entries Total: Susan Turk reported that she has only seen 13 entries so far for our guild, out of the total of 122 quilts entered from all 6 guilds. The Arlington Quilt Guild has entered the most so far. *Deadline is June 1st.* Contact her or Deborah Kay if you are having trouble with the online entry system.

Volunteers: Susan urged members to volunteer for the Expo which can be done online at the Expo website and/or for the guilds—selling T-shirts, for example. There is a separate website for the guilds. Contact Susan for more information.

Quilt Show Minis and Expo Classes: Deborah Kay reported that only 44 minis have been entered. The guilds have been given an extension of *June 15th.* This is the other moneymaker for our guild. She showed some of the minis she had entered and encouraged everyone to make and enter one. There is no charge to enter a mini which should not be larger than 24" x 24". Open enrollment for Expo Classes will be in the next week or so.

Angel Quilts: Donna Reid provided a background on this Guild activity for the new member. She showed a sample of the completed quilt made with the butterfly pattern that Suzanna Fox had emailed everyone this week and offered tips. She awarded the 4 red points to Pansy Shehee.

Love Thy Baby: La Cora McSwain explained the Guild's involvement in this activity for the new member and as a reminder to membership.

Show and Tell: Angel quilts led off this activity. There were no patriotic quilts. Connie Angeles showed a "personal", 105" x 105" top that she is keeping once it's quilted.

The meeting ended with door prizes being awarded.

Meeting called to order at 2:03 p.m. by Susan Holt, Vice President.

Retreats: Ginny North started off the meeting with an update on the 2024 Guild Spring retreat. She and the Board feel that it is time for a change from Compass. She has done some investigation and has reserved the Sunset Retreat & Quilt Shop for the Guild's 2024 Spring Retreat. It will be held April 4-7, 2024, which misses the Dallas Quilt Show and Spring Break. It has more amenities and services available like the Scissor Man, if needed. The Fall Retreat will be held at the same location, Red Boot, from Oct 12-15, 2023.

Finance: Jerry Bowen reported that there was nothing unexpected in expenses for April. She talked to the treasurer of the Show. The Guild will have to pay upfront for the T-shirts but will get the money back.

Quilt Show Update: Carol Cook will not be attending the May meeting, but Judy Poole will be available to sell T-shirts. This will be the last meeting to order a Show T-shirt. Jerry Bowen announced that all Show minis are due June 1st.

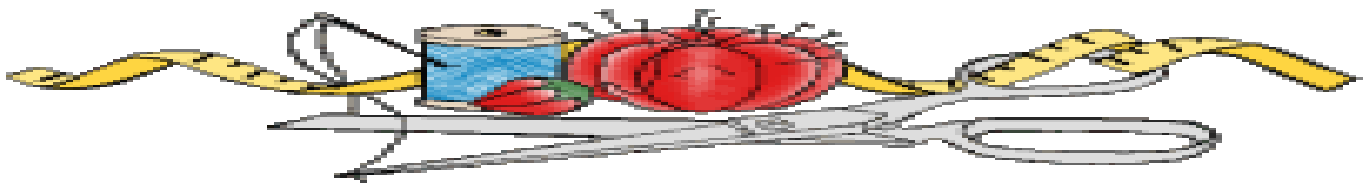

This is information for entering a quilt in show.

Please have the following ready to present for entry:

Name, address, email

Master or Artisan (if you don't know, we can help you)

Category (if you need help, we can help you)

Name of quilt and if you quilted yourself or the name of the longarm quilter.

A short description of the quilt.

Measurement of quilt

Image or Facsimile of the quilt

Do you want it to travel?



Quilt width must be 96" or less due to site limitations. Quilts wider than 96" WILL NOT be accepted. Quilts over 90" in height have special sleeve requirements. Please see the sleeve requirements in the Quilt Preparation section. 5. The Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry that it deems inappropriate or that does not meet the requirements.

1. Sleeve – Quilts must have an attached, sewn 4" sleeve. Quilts under 24" may have a 2" sewn attached sleeve. The sleeve should be the same width as the quilt, not including the binding. The sleeve should include ½" of ease and be stitched to the quilt on both the top and bottom of the sleeve. Entries without a sewn sleeve will not be accepted. Quilts longer than 90" require the top of the sleeve to be placed 90" from the bottom of the quilt to ensure that the quilt will not touch the floor when hanging.

2. Festival Quilt Identity Label – A quilt label should be sewn on the lower back corner. The label should include a) the name of the quilt; b) the entrant's name; c) the entrant's address; d) the entrant's phone number. This is a Festival Quilt Identity Label; a personal label does not substitute unless it includes all of the above information. To ensure impartiality in judging, please apply a fabric flap sewn or carefully safety pinned along the top edge of any label with identification of the maker(s) in order to conceal your personal information.

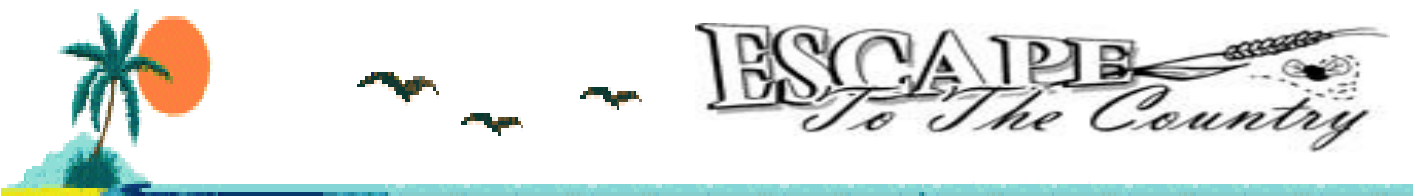
3. Fabric Bag – Each separate entry must be submitted to check-in in a fabric pillowcase or any fabric bag sized to fit your quilt (no plastic bags). The outside of the fabric bag must be clearly labeled with the entrant's name and phone number in permanent lettering either sewn or in ink.

Brussel Sprouts

1 lb Brussel sprouts
 4 tbsp butter
 4 tbsp olive oil
 Salt and pepper

sauce

1/2 cup honey
 1/4 cup sugar
 1/4 cup soy sauce
 1.5 tsp ground ginger
 Red pepper flakes
 Crispy onion strips

Combine sauce ingredients in a saucepan and cook until you bring it to a boil.

Stir constantly for a few minutes and remove from heat – let cool completely at room temperature (unless using the quick method recommended above)

Preheat the oven to 400 degrees

Wash Brussel sprouts and cut them in half – pat dry
 Melt butter and olive oil together and combine with salt and pepper

Toss with Brussel sprouts in a bowl and place on a baking sheet Roast 35-40 minutes until crispy. Toss partway through.

Combine Brussel sprouts with the crispy onion strips and toss everything with the sauce.
 Serve immediately

Title: Overkill (2022)

Author: Sandra Brown

Genre: Romantic Thriller

Former Super Bowl MVP quarterback Zach Bridger hasn't seen his ex-wife, Rebecca Pratt, for some time—not since their volatile marriage imploded—so he's shocked to receive a life-altering call about her. Rebecca has been placed on life support after a violent assault, and he—despite their divorce—has medical power-of-attorney. Zach is asked to make an impossible choice: keep her on life support or take her off of it. Buckling under the weight of the responsibility and the glare of public scrutiny, Zach ultimately walks away, letting Rebecca's parents have the final say.

Four years later, Rebecca's attacker, Eban—the scion of a wealthy family in Atlanta—gets an early release from prison. The ludicrous miscarriage of justice reeks of favoritism, and Kate Lennon, a brilliant state prosecutor, is determined to put him back behind bars. Rebecca's parents have kept her alive all these years, but if her condition were to change—if she were to die—Eban could be retried on a new charge: murder.

It isn't lost on Zach that in order for Eban to be charged with Rebecca's murder, Zach must actually be the one to kill her. He rejects Kate's legal standpoint but can't resist their ill-timed attraction to each other. Eban, having realized the jeopardy he's in, plots to make certain that neither Zach nor Kate lives to see the death of Rebecca—and the end of his freedom.

Bacon wrapped with brown sugar and butter

- | 1 pound bacon
- | 1 pound Lil' Smokees
- | 1 stick of butter
- | 2 cups brown sugar
- | Preheat oven 375 degrees F . Cutting bacon to thirds & roll every smoked piece (small sausage) Placing all rolled stacks in single layer in baking dish.
- | Then melting stick of butter, & a cup of brown sugar, & stir to well mixed. Pour butter & brown sugar mix on smoke and bacon. Then taking other cup of brown sugar and sprinkling it evenly over the smoke. Baking for 15-20 minutes, then raise the heat to 400F for 5 min

Do you backstitch?

Backstitching at the beginning and ending of each seam? Generally, not required. The patchwork process secures the seams in the next patch, block or seam so it isn't necessary to backstitch. On a few occasions, I have found the seams to come apart on the ends by a stitch or two but it hasn't been an issue for me. One tip is to use more stitches per inch which makes for a tighter hold but also is harder to rip out if

Always use a seam allowance of at least ¼”.

The standard when quilting is to use a ¼” seam allowance on all your pieced blocks. If you are a beginner, it may be helpful to use a larger seam allowance such as ½”.

A seam that's less than ¼” can be problematic because any tension put on that seam could cause the fabric to fray and the seams to come undone.

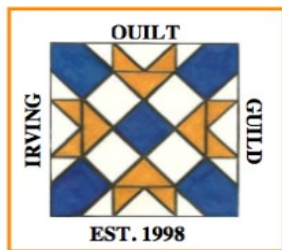

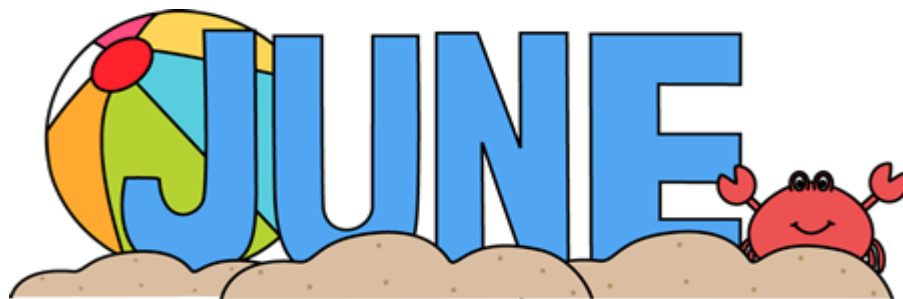
