IRVING QUILT GUILD GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Date: June 15, 2023

Vice President Susan Holt called the business meeting to order at 7:23 p.m. All attendees had just been enjoying the June potluck "picnic" of a great variety of good food and natural centerpieces. Gayle Henegar, who pulled it altogether, thanked everyone who brought food. The Guild will do this again in December.

Sunshine & Shadows: Jackie Wagner started off the meeting with Shadows. Alene Winn has had 3 surgeries and must have a 4th one. Nancy Norris' sister had artery surgery and was sent home to recuperate. Jerry Tollett fell down and broke her arm.

Birthdays: Members sang "Happy Birthday" to Ernestine Chipman and Jean Sullivan. The other June birthday babies—Anne Lawrence, June Page, Linda Scott, and Shawn Carr--were not present.

New Members & Guests: One new member signed up at this meeting & one guest—Deborah Kay's sister, Gwen.

25th Anniversary Exhibit: Ernestine updated the membership regarding the Irving Archives & Museum exhibit for the Guild. She announced to the Board that she has commitments from 10 people now for a total of 22 quilts, 4 sewing machines, and a small number of various notions. She asked for favorite books and patterns to be added to the list of items being requested. She has blank Museum loan agreement forms for anyone wanting to loan items. She requested that the forms be filled out and signed tonight or tomorrow morning. Members can email them to her or drop them off Friday morning on her front porch. She will be delivering them along with photos of the items to the Museum staff Friday afternoon. The exhibit will open on Sunday, September 17th, and close on Sunday, January 7, 2024.

Quilt Show: Carol Cook announced that the Quilt Show currently has 305 quilts from all 6 guilds. Judy Poole reported that all of her \$12 tickets have been sold. You can still obtain \$12 tickets (at the door, \$15 each) at local quilt stores, but the Guild only receives half of the proceeds from the stores. Sign-up Genius is available for those members wanting to volunteer for the Show—i.e. selling T-shirts, hanging & taking down quilts, and other similar activities. Suzanna Fox will be glad to deliver any member's quilt(s) for the Show on the Sunday before it starts, for members who are not able to do this themselves.

Mini quilts and Quilt Show Store: Lori Vauble is handling the mini quilts. The 6 guilds have entered 80 quilts, which Carol says is not many compared to past years. The deadline has been extended to June 30th.

Quilt Show Booth: Lori showed some new patterns, a chicken potholder and a bottle opener, for which she needs sewers. She was able to give away all her kits during this meeting.

Veterans Picnic: Carol reported that 22 guys attended the picnic. She sent photos from the event to Susan Turk for the website. She read a "thank you" note from the picnic's sponsor. She has some quilts left over for next year. Susan Holt reminded the Guild's new members that the Membership Directory contains more background information on this event.

June Workshop: Deborah Kay showed a sample of the tulip block that attendees will be making on Saturday, the 17th. It is being held in the same room as the one used for General Meetings, from 9 a.m. to "whenever we finish". It is brown bag. Irons will be provided.

July Workshop: Deborah will be teaching painting on fabric for July's workshop. The result could be used for a wall hanging or purse. She will provide a supply list closer to the event. It will be \$40 each.

July Program: Susan Holt announced that one of the Quilters Dream's staff will be speaking in July. She will have more details later.

Angel Quilts: Donna Reid announced that she has some dog fabric for Angel Quilts. Pansy Shehee showed an example of a dog quilt. Pansy won the 4 red points drawing.

Show and Tell: Summer quilts, the theme of this meeting, led off Show and Tell. Several members who brought summer quilts, got to keep the centerpieces.

The meeting ended with door prizes being awarded.

The Vice President adjourned the meeting at 8:30 p.m.

Meeting called to order at 2:15 p.m. by Susan Holt, Vice President. It was a short meeting because there was not a quorum to vote on anything new.

Finance: Susan Holt passed around copies of Jerry Bowen's June Finance report. There were no questions. Then, Susan Holt went over the agenda for the June General Meeting. She asked each board member present if they had something to report. She made reports for those not present.

Sunshine and Shadows: Susan will have Jackie Wagner start off with Sunshine and Shadows. Jackie will be at the June General Meeting. She was back on her feet—attended Threadpickers today. She will have blank forms the night of the Meeting. Ernestine also suggested that the Friendship groups consider meeting at the Museum's maker lab on one of the exhibit days so that the public could quilts being made. Donna Reid said that she would be glad to help out with that.

Quilt Show: Susan Turk and Carol Cook will provide Show updates. Carol may also provide an update on the Veterans picnic. Susan Holt has not received any updates from Carol Cook or Susan Turk on the number of quilts received for the Quilt Show.

Membership: Suzanna Fox will have nothing to report.

Retreats: Ginny might have something to report, but Susan Holt has not received anything new from her.

Programs and Workshops:

June General Meeting: Gail Hensley, Hospitality, has enough food. Members will eat first and then Susan Holt will have the business meeting. Gayle will thank all the members who brought food just before Donna talks about Angel Quilts and Show and Tell. The drawing will end the meeting. Pansy Shehee suggested that when members are at a quilt shop, that they ask for door prizes. They should tell the staff that the prizes are for the Guild's charities.





Angel Quilt Info

There were 15 beautiful Angel Quilts collected in June. Our total delivered to Scottish Rite is 123. That number is easy to remember. Thank you everyone! We have five more months this year to earn points and reach our

300-quilt goal. Our butterfly quilts should be flying in soon.

Remember the small quilts are worth 4 points for piecing and 3 points to the quilter. If you do both you receive both. The size is a minimum of 90 inches. One length plus one width. The large quilt is worth 8 points for the piercer and 6 for the quilter. If you do both you earn both. The size is minimum 120".

The quilt must have the top, batting and backing. It must be quilted not tied. There cannot be any buttons or bows attached to the quilt because children receive them.

If you notice I never draw the winning ticket for the Lite Red Raffle. They're totally randomly picked. Pansy Shehee won in June. That makes two months in a row. In addition to winning 4 points each time she won some fabric. Pansy did a wonderful job creating the quilt with the heart panel and red fabric. Her plans are to attach a pocket for valentines and other secrets. Can't wait to see what Pansy creates with the dog fabric she won.

Wash your hands. Clean hands are good for our fabric as well.

POTATO PANCAKES

1 large baking potato

1 small onion

1/4 cup all-purpose flour

1 large egg, lightly beaten

1 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon freshly ground pepper


Vegetable oil, for frying

INSTRUCTIONS

Peel the potato and onion and coarsely shred them into strips. but you could also use a food processor or a box grater.) Use a cheesecloth or a colander to squeeze the vegetables as dry as possible. Let stand for 2 minutes, then squeeze dry again.

In a large bowl, whisk the flour, egg, salt and pepper together. Stir in the potato onion mixture until all pieces are evenly coated. In a medium skillet, heat 2 tablespoons of vegetable oil until simmering. Drop small circles of the potato mixture into the skillet, flattening them with the back of a spoon if necessary.

Cook over moderately high heat until the edges are golden, about 1-1/2 minutes; Flip and cook until golden on the bottom, about 1 minute. Drain excess oil on paper towels. Repeat with the remaining potato mixture, adding more oil to the skillet as needed. You can keep finished latkes heated in the oven at 200 °F while you're making the rest so they're all hot and ready to go at the same time.

12-14 basil leaves, washed

1 C. heavy cream

½ C. butter

1/4 t. cracked black pepper

lemon juice (opt.)
