IRVING QUILT GUILD GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Date: December 14, 2023

Guild's Christmas Celebration. December's meeting was the Christmas party. Members who attended November's meeting selected one Christmas-themed paper puzzle piece that they had to match up with another member's puzzle piece. Both members with the matching pieces decided who would cook and what to cook—dessert, salad, or side dish—or what table decorations to bring and then signed up on the appropriate item's sheet. The person who didn't cook would make enough copies for all members of the recipe for the item that their partner cooked. The Guild provided ham. The result was a wide variety of salads, potato dishes, and desserts, and some beautiful table decorations which everyone enjoyed.

Business Meeting: President Alene Winn officially called a brief business meeting to order around 7:30 p.m. The following areas were covered.

25th Anniversary Museum Exhibit: Ernestine then updated the membership on the Irving Archives & Museum exhibit (see article published further in this newsletter).

January General Meeting and Future 2024 Meetings: Donna Reid is working with Holy Family Catholic's staff to secure the Gonzalez Room for 2024 Guild General Meeting and workshops. An email will be sent before the January 18th meeting.

48-Hour Workshop: Donna announced that the Workshop would meet in the Gonzalez Room. Attendees may want to bring extension cords. Ginny North reminded all participants that it will be held on January 20th. RSVPs are required because lunch will be provided. Beverly Ingram, the instructor for this class, showed a sample of the quilt that will be made. Jelly roll strips or 2.5" squares could be used.

President's Quilt: Ginny presented President Alene Winn with a member-made quilt to thank her for her service as the Guild's president. The quilt was made using a house block design in several shades of purple—both Alene's favorites. Alene was very touched and thanked everyone for their support—calls, cards, etc.—during her many surgeries and post recovery. Vice President, Susan Holt, who served as President for Alene during her surgeries and recovery, was given a gift certificate as a thank you.

Spring 2024 Retreat: Ginny reminded everyone that the Spring 2024 retreat will be held April 4-7, 2024, at Sunset. It is \$270 for the 3 nights. She has started collecting money. February's General meeting is the last meeting that she will accept payments.

Membership: Suzanna Fox reminded members that they will have until January's General meeting—on January 18th—to renew their membership for 2024. Dues are \$30/year. Cash or check accepted. No new application is needed unless there are changes.

I Found a Quilted Heart project: Cynthia Gladden talked about the project that the Threadpickers Friendship group is participating in and the organization behind it. The I Found a Quilt Heart group, started in 2014, encourages people to make quilted hearts and leave them in public places, like local libraries and parks, without your name, for other people to find. The idea is to "spread a heart" to uplift a person's day. The group's website, <https://ifoundaquiltedheart.com>, has some uplifting stories and information on how to participate.

2024 Quilt Show: Shawn Carr asked everyone to be on the lookout for any ideas, patterns, etc. that have to do with the theme of bees, to be made into items for the Quilt Show Booth. Debra Kay asked everyone to consider entering a quilt in the Show. Applications will be available in paper format this year.

Gift Exchange: Those members who wanted to participate, brought gifts and were able to select another participant's gift, based upon their birthday month. Reverse birthday month order was used.

Show and Tell and Door Prizes: There was not any Show and Tell or Door Prize drawing. The game, Left-Right-Center, closed out the meeting. The winners selected their prize from the Door Prize table.

The President adjourned the meeting at 8:10 p.m.


****QUILT EXHIBIT AT THE IRVING ARCHIVES AND MUSEUM UPDATE ****

!!!*The Exhibit ends in 3.5 weeks (Sunday, January 7th)!!!* Please consider bringing your friends, family, or neighbors to visit the Exhibit during the holidays and also view the historical exhibit about the City of Irving (has a model flight simulator that anyone can fly). The Museum's admission is free on all Sundays in December, except December 24th and December 31st when they are closed for the holidays. Admission on Wednesday through Saturday: \$7 for adults; \$5 for children, ages 4-17; \$5 for Seniors (65+) and Military personnel; and Free for Children under 3 years. Hours are Wednesday through Saturday, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Sunday, 12 p.m. to 4 p.m.

There are no more Guild activities planned for the Exhibit. Recent activities in December included the Threadpickers making quilted hearts in the Museum's SparkLab on December 9th to support the international campaign, "[I Found A Quilted Heart](#).", (see more information about this organization in the General Meeting Minutes page of this newsletter). Suzanna Fox and Ernestine Chipman made a brief presentation on the Guild and offered guidance on viewing the Exhibit, to 17 4th graders on December 7th. Afterwards, Suzanna and Ernestine encouraged the students to take home some Family Funday placemats and puzzles which contained the Guild's business card which they did enthusiastically. One young boy was impressed by the age of Ginny North's grandmother's quilt (made in 1890's), another girl seemed very interested in entering a quilt in the Quilt Show. She is taking sewing classes and her mother quilts (Suzanna gave her a Guild business card).

Ernestine Chipman will be following up soon with a date when members can pick up the items that they lent to the Exhibit.

PECAN PIE BROWNIES!

Ingredients:

1 box Brownie mix, must have instructions for making in 13x9 pan + ingredients listed on the package

Pecan Pie Filling:

1 cup Sugar

1 1/2 cups Light Corn syrup

4 Eggs

1/4 cup unsalted butter

1 1/2 teaspoon Vanilla extract

2 cups Pecans, roughly chopped

Instructions:

Preheat oven according to brownie package instructions.

Whisk together the sugar, corn syrup, eggs, butter, and vanilla in a small saucepan. Place on the stovetop over medium-high heat and begin to cook, stirring continuously.

Mix brownies according to package instructions. Pour brownie batter into a greased 13x9 inch pan and place in the oven to bake for 20 minutes. * see note about cooking time below.

As the brownies bake the filling in the saucepan should have thickened enough to coat your spoon (about 15 minutes). Stir the pecans into the mixture and continue to cook for 2-3 minutes until the mixture reaches the consistency of runny oatmeal. You want it to be loose enough to pour over the brownies but not liquid.

When the brownies have finished pre-baking remove them from the oven and pour the pecan pie filling over them spreading it out to cover the brownies completely.



Chinese Pepper Steak with Onion!!

Ingredients :


- 1. five lb beef strips
- 1 bell pepper, reduce into thick slices
- 1 purple bell pepper, reduce into thick slices
- half of thick minced onion
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- half of cups beef broth
- 1/4 teaspoon ginger
- three tablespoons of soy sauce
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper
- 2 teaspoons brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch

*Methods :

- Place the red meat, peppers and onions in an electric powered stress cooker.
- Addition of season, brown sugar & soy sauce on red meat/peppers.
- Pour red meat broth into Instant Pot.
- Stir to combine.
- Add the lid and ensure it's far tightly closed. Set stress to excessive for 15 min.
- When you are carried out for a fast release (or in case you need the steak to crumble, do a herbal release)
- Remove the duvet and press the Cancel button. Then transfer the stress cooker to sauté mode.
- In a separate small bowl, blend 1/4 cup cold water with a table-spoon of cornstarch together. Then stir the pepper steak mixture into the Instant Pot.
- Bring to a boil for three to five mins till the sauce starts to thicken.
- Enjoy !
