## IRVING QUILT GUILD GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Date: January 18, 2024

**General Meeting Minutes:** President Shawn Carr opened the meeting at 6:55 p.m. with Ernestine Chipman asking for any corrections to the minutes for the November and December 2023 General Meetings, as published in the December 2023 and January 2024 newsletters, respectively. Both sets of minutes were unanimously approved by voice vote.

**Love Thy Baby:** LaCora McSwain announced 2 new opportunities for members to help this charity. First one: She has 4 kits of cut squares to sew together into quilts, 6 across and 7 down. Second one: Love Thy Baby volunteers also make fabric scraps and batting into pillowcase-sized dog and cat beds which they donate to shelters in Coppell and Forney. They would furnish the scrap bags and our members would stuff and sew up the beds. Please contact LaCora if you are interested.

**2024 Quilt Show:** Susan Turk announced that she and Debra Kay will be meeting with Hoffman on Friday, the 19<sup>th</sup>, to talk about debugging entry forms. She will be part of a mock test of the company's form. She also made a plea for everyone to make quilts, whether full sized or mini. The quilt show is 5 ½ months from now—August 1<sup>st</sup> – August 3<sup>rd</sup>. The show's organizers will probably start receiving entries in March/April.

**Quilt Show Booth:** Shawn Carr, Booth Chair, asked everyone again to be on the lookout for any ideas, patterns, etc. that have to do with the theme of bees, to be made into items for the Quilt Show Booth. LaCora has a pattern for a wrap that can be used on a cup or mug. Shawn showed everyone a beehive cushion for which she would like 10 made and pins with bee heads for which she needs 9. If interested, please bring a zip lock bag to the next meeting. She has a 10-lb bag of walnut shells for the pin cushions. Linda Cole will be making bee-themed zipper bags.

**Sunshine and Shadows:** Jackie Wagner started off by asking everyone who has any news, sunshine or shadows, to call her. She doesn't have email. Sunshine: She had Gail Walsh share messages from one of the recipients of an Angel Quilt, Mason, and his mother who were so appreciative. Shadows: Elaine Doell has a bad sinus infection. Linda Scott is "under the weather" too. The saddest news was announced by Susan Holt about Maria Perez, who died on December 22<sup>nd</sup>. The Guild collected \$228 to give to Maria; her live-in friend, Ron; and her son, David. The house will be put in a trust for David, who has been placed in a special home for autistic people. Some of Maria's fabric will be coming back to the Guild. Her 2022 Best-of-Show quilt has been sold. Birthdays: There are 8 January birthdays to celebrate. Everyone sang "Happy Birthday" to: Evelyn Banks, Linda Cole, Maria Perez, Susie Barber, Mandy Carr, Anne Lawrence, Suzie Robbins, and Bonnie Sloan.

**25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Museum Exhibit:** Shawn asked everyone present to give Ernestine Chipman a round of applause for all her hard work on this exhibit. Ernestine thanked everyone who loaned items, those who attended the exhibit with friends or family, and those who participated in the Second Saturday activities. All loaned items have been returned to their owners.

**Membership:** Guests: Maria Ortega joined the meeting for the first time. Dues: Suzanna Fox reported that she still has some members who have not renewed yet. Dues are \$30/year. Cash or check accepted. No new application is needed unless there are changes. She hopes to have the new directories available at the February meeting. Family Funday: Is March 10<sup>th</sup>, the second Sunday in March, at the Irving Arts Center, from 1-4 p.m. Suzana has 7 packages of kits with 14 different patterns for which she needs help making the puzzles. She also needs volunteers to assist the day of the Funday. Email Suzanna if interested. Open Studio Lab: Is a program for teens, held at the Center. Sara Schacht has agreed to hold a fabric collage program for the Lab. The Guild will provide the fabric, the Center, the boards for the collage and other supplies.

**48-Hour Workshop:** Ginny North announced that the Workshop would be held in the Church's Library, starting at 9 a.m. on the 19<sup>th</sup>. Twenty-five have confirmed attendance. Lunch will be Chick-Fil-A.

**Spring 2024 Retreat:** Ginny reminded everyone again that the Spring 2024 retreat will be held April 4-7, at Sunset. Check-in will be on the 4<sup>th</sup>, at 10 a.m. February's General meeting is the last meeting that she will accept payments.

**2024 “New” Activities:** Shawn challenged everyone to do something new in 2024 that has a purposeful end. Her proposed ideas: 1) Get-together on several Saturdays to make mini quilts; 2) Block-of-the-Month; 3) Round Robin; and 4) Secret Santa/Sister: Have a drawing; gather items for 3-4 meetings and then reveal at December meeting.

**February Program:** New Vice President, Donna Reid, explained the activity—Fabric Bingo—that will be February’s General Meeting program. She passed around a list of 30 fabric categories from which members should select 25 and cut 25 2 1/2 squares to be sewn together into a fabric bingo card. She recommended a 1/8” stitch around the edge to secure all the squares. Buttons will be used as tokens. Prizes will be awarded. The meeting and program will be held in the Gonzalez Room.

**January Program:** After a break, Suzanna handed out pins for perfect attendance and 48+ hours of volunteer activities in 2023.

**Show and Tell:** Carol Cook announced during Show and Tell that she needs quilts for the Defenders of Freedom picnic, which is being held on Sunday, May 19<sup>th</sup>. Donna Reid, who will continue to lead the Angel Quilt Committee, awarded 4 pink points and some fabric to Sara Schacht. Jackie Wagner suggested that anyone making an Angel Quilt include a cat on it to honor Maria Perez.

**Door Prizes** ended the meeting.

The President adjourned the meeting at 8:25 p.m.

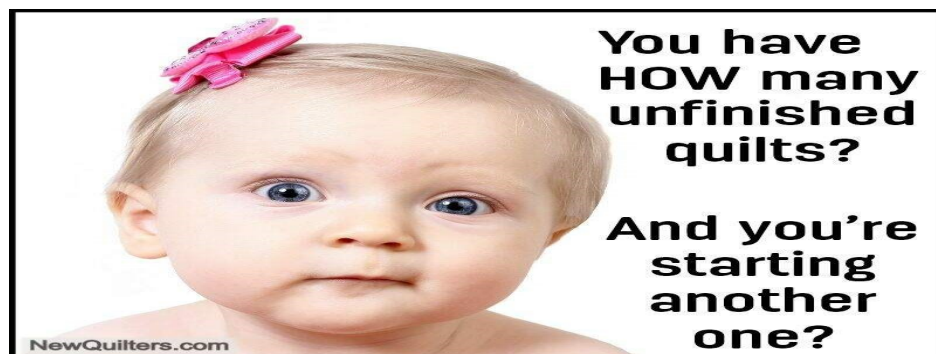

## **Defenders of Freedom Annual Picnic 2024**

As most of us know, the Guild used to be a member of the Quilts of Valor program, but we decided a few years ago to just concentrate our efforts supporting the Defenders of Freedom Foundation. One reason being we already were sending most of our quilts to the picnic since it was a local endeavor. The other reason was because the costs of being a member of QOV was going up every year and we as a group were not benefiting at all from it. So we withdrew our membership.

Defenders of Freedom helps our wounded service members find treatment or help groups for any lingering problems from brain injury, depression, PTSD and loss of mobility. They have chapters in several major cities now and they strive to connect the veterans with other veterans so they can help each other also. We serve the Dallas area. Donna Cranston teamed over 10 years ago with local residents Joe and Teresa LaSole in Irving to provide the people attending this weeklong event a chance to get together away from press and sponsors to just relax, eat Joe's BBQ, listen to music and play in Joe's "Man Cave" party barn. Joe provides everything and the work is done by his friends who volunteer their labor. Our Guild has been providing a quilt to each participant who has never received a quilt before for their service. We do ask them this questions again the day of the picnic. These men and women are so surprised and honored to get one. They carry them on to the bus when they leave and use them as soon as they get home. I have heard from some that when they are having an episode they will curl up with their quilt and try to get through whatever is going on.

This year the picnic is on Sunday May 19<sup>th</sup>. Last year we handed out 22 quilts. We could need up to 29 or 30 depending on how many make the trip. I encourage all of you to like Defenders of Freedom on Facebook to see treatment updates and on the week of the picnic they will be posting all the events the participants are involved in with pictures and stories. There will be pictures of the picnic and golf tournament and treatment evaluations.

They are a great group of people who have sacrificed a lot for this country, and they live with the scars daily.

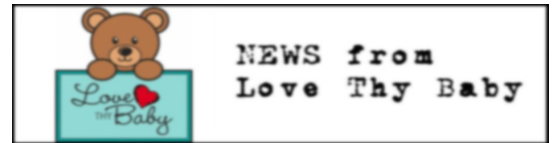
## One Pot Mexican Rice Casserole

1 Pound Ground Beef  
1 Small Onion  
salt to taste  
black pepper to taste  
2 tbsp Taco Seasoning  
1 tsp Garlic Powder  
1 Cup Long Grain White Rice  
1 1/2 Cups Beef Broth  
1 15 Ounce Can Corn  
8 Ounces Tomato Sauce  
1/2 Cup Salsa  
1 Cup Shredded Cheese

Cook the ground beef and onion together with salt and pepper to taste in a large skillet over medium high heat until beef is no longer pink. Drain grease if necessary. Return the pan to the stove and sprinkle the beef with the garlic powder and taco seasoning.

Stir in the rice, broth, corn, tomato sauce, and salsa. Bring mixture to a boil. Cover, reduce heat and simmer for 18-20 minutes until rice is tender. Top with cheese and return the lid to the pan for 2-3 minutes until cheese is melted.

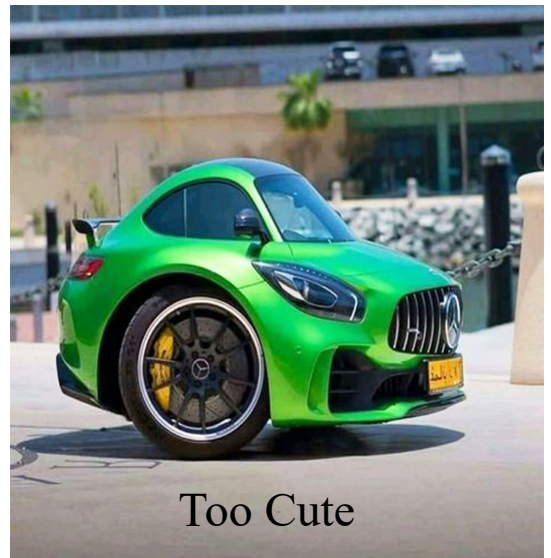

## Christmas Apricot and Walnut Fruitcake

1 cup all-purpose flour  
1/2 teaspoon baking powder  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 cup unsalted butter, at room temperature  
1 cup granulated sugar  
2 large eggs, at room temperature  
1/2 cup milk  
2 cups chopped dried apricots  
2 cups chopped walnuts  
1 cup candied cherries, halved  
1/2 cup brandy  
1 teaspoon vanilla extract

### Instructions:

Preheat the oven to 300°F (150°C). Grease a 9-inch loaf pan and line it with parchment paper.

In a medium bowl, whisk together the flour, baking powder, and salt.

In a large mixing bowl, cream together the butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add the eggs one at a time, mixing well after each addition.

Add the flour mixture to the butter mixture in three parts, alternating with the milk and mixing well after each addition.

Fold in the chopped apricots, walnuts, and candied cherries.

Pour the batter into the prepared loaf pan and smooth out the top.

Bake for 2 hours, or until a toothpick inserted in the center of the cake comes out clean.

While the cake is baking, prepare the brandy syrup. In a small saucepan, heat the brandy and vanilla extract over medium heat until the mixture begins to simmer. Remove from heat.

When the cake is done, remove it from the oven and let it cool in the pan for 10 minutes. Then, use a toothpick or skewer to poke holes all over the top of the cake.

Pour the warm brandy syrup over the cake, letting it soak in.

Let the cake cool completely in the pan before removing it and slicing.

This Christmas Apricot and Walnut Fruitcake is perfect for the holiday season, with its delicious blend of apricots, walnuts, and cherries. Enjoy!
