IRVING QUILT GUILD GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Date: : February 16, 2024

Shawn Carr called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and asked for any visitors or new members. Suzanna Fox announced 2 new members—Pat Henry, also a member of the Quilters Guild of Dallas; and Stephanie Carmack, a former member from 2001-2006.

Sunshine and Shadows: Jackie Wagner started off with 4 Shadows: Linda Cole had a very good friend pass away. Aileen Winn had to have heart surgery again on her leg. On February 12, Aileen's friend, Millard, was hospitalized in the Infectious Disease Unit. Thenia Haynes fell and broke her arm below the shoulder. <u>Sunshine</u>: Everyone sang "happy birthday" to 4 members with February birthdays. Debra Kay announced that she is engaged.

Family Funday: Suzanna announced that she has all the volunteers that she needs for this event, which is on March 10^{th} , 2-4 p.m. at the Irving Arts Center.

Membership: Suzanna also announced that all the membership directories are on the back table. She will mail any that are not picked up at this meeting.

Spring 2024 Retreat: Ginny North reminded everyone that this meeting is the last night to pay for the Spring retreat to be held April 4-7, at Sunset. Total cost is \$270.

General Meeting Minutes: Ernestine Chipman asked for any corrections to the minutes for the January General Meeting, as published in the February 2024 newsletter. The Minutes were unanimously approved by voice vote.

2024 Quilt Show: Debra Kay announced that Quilt Show entries open on February 17th. The entry process is much easier this year. Final deadline for entries is May 28th. She will have hard copies of the forms for minis, regulars, and juniors. Entries need to contain recognizable pictures of the quilts. Each guild is also loaning 2 quilts to the Show for last-minute gaps. Carol Cook announced that she needs Show minis which should be no smaller than 6 x 6 and no larger than 24 x 24.

<u>Quilt Show Booth</u>: Shawn Carr, Booth Chair, and Carol Cook showed some additional samples of bee-themed items for the Booth—a 6 x 6 trivet, potato bags, and 10 chickens with spools for feet. LaCora McSwain also made some beehive pincushions.

Mini Quilt Challenge: Donna Reid announced and explained a new challenge. She passed around a bag with paint chips for everyone present to pick a color without looking. Each person will make a mini quilt with that color in it and any other color they choose. Deadline is May meeting at which all the minis will be judged for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place awards.

Thank you and New Meeting Activity: Shawn read a thank you letter from the Irving Fire Department thanking the Guild for its Blue Christmas donations. She and Jackie Wagner then engaged in a new monthly meeting activity—"Meet Your Fellow Quilter"—a 5-minute interview with a different Guild member. Shawn was the first interviewee.

Love Thy Baby: LaCora thanked everyone for their Love Thy Baby assistance. She has expanded this activity to include Love Thy Pet beds to benefit the Irving Animal Shelter. She recommends using upholstery fabric. Any size is welcome. Beds are worth 2 volunteer points each.

March Program: Will be a presentation by Dorene Joyce. There will not be a workshop.

Show and Tell: Donna awarded 4 red points and some fabric to Linda Cole.

February Program: Guild members were treated to roses with chocolates, one for each person, as well as water, iced tea, and Coke. Then everyone had a great time playing Fabric Bingo. A member at each Bingo table will make an Angel quilt out of all their table's fabric cards.

Door Prizes ended the meeting. The President adjourned the meeting at 8:30 p.m.

Caramel Crispix

Ingredients

2 small boxes of Crispix Cereal 2 cups of butter 2 cups of brown sugar ½ cup Light Karo syrup ½ tsp Vanilla ½ tsp Baking Soda

Instructions

Melt butter in a saucepan. Add brown sugar and bring to a boil. Add Karo syrup, vanilla and baking soda. Put the cereal in a large bowl then pour mixture over the cereal.

My favorite way to make Brussels sprouts...marinated overnight! In a gallon size zip bag combine juice of 1 lemon, 1 T olive oil, pepper, paprika and garlic salt. Add in Brussels (cut in half or quartered), seal bag and toss around until well coated. Refrigerate overnight. When ready to roast, preheat oven to 400, place Brussels on baking sheet and bake for 15-20 minutes. Feel free to eat the entire pan, they are that good!

Mini Quilt Challenge

I hope picking a paint chip to get your color has started giving you ideas for your mini quilt. It's due at the May meeting.

You must have your color as the main color in your quilt, any shade.

The quilts will be voted on by IQG. First prize is \$100, second \$75, third is \$50. The prize money was donated

I would like your quilt to be turned in for the show auction but you can keep it.

Size requirements are no side smaller than 6" and no larger than 24". Please attach a 2" wide sleeve on the back and a label with Irving Quilt Guild on it. We'll enter it in the auction.

Always use a seam allowance of at least 1/4".

The standard when quilting is to use a ¼" seam allowance on all your pieced blocks. If you are a beginner, it may be helpful to use a larger seam allowance such as ½".

A seam that's less than 1/4" can be problematic because any tension put on that seam could cause the fabric to fray and the seams to come undone.



The seam ripper: friend or foe?

It may seem like the seam ripper isn't a tool you'd want to use, but a seam ripper will soon become one of your favorite tools. When you are drawing a picture, sometimes you need to use an eraser, right?

Think of the seam ripper as the quilter's eraser. It is much easier to remove unwanted stitches with a seam ripper than trying to do it with a pair of scissors or by hand.


Linda Cole won the Lite Red Raffle. She gets 4 points and a small bundle of fabric including cats. Thank you everyone.


Wash your hands. Clean hands are good for our fabric as well.


Misty's Book Nook

Southern Candied Sweet Potatoes

2 cups white sugar
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1 teaspoon ground nutmeg
1 pinch salt
1/2 cup butter
6 sweet potatoes, peeled and sliced
1 tablespoon vanilla extract

In a small bowl, mix the sugar, cinnamon, nutmeg, and salt together.

Melt butter in a large skillet over medium heat; add sweet potatoes, and stir to coat. Sprinkle sugar mixture over the sweet potatoes, and stir.

Cover skillet, and reduce heat to low. Cook, stirring occasionally, for 1 hour, or until the sauce is dark and the potatoes are candied.

They should be tender, but a little hard around the edges.

Stir in vanilla, and serve.
