IRVING QUILT GUILD GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Date: March 21, 2024

Shawn Carr called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Business meeting was held first, followed by the speaker, a break, and then Show and Tell and Door Prizes.

Sunshine and Shadows: Jackie Wagner started off the meeting with no Shadows. She asked Pansy Shehee to tell her Sunshine story. Pansy made one of the quilted hearts as a participant in the Threadpickers' Museum Exhibit activity last October. She left it on Valentine's Day at the CVS Pharmacy location at North MacArthur. Someone found it while buying diabetes medicine and posted it on the I Found a Quilted Heart website 10 days later. The recipient was really excited to find it and felt great pleasure from it.

Birthdays: Members sang "Happy Birthday" to Nancy Norris, and Judy Poole.

Guests and New Members: There were 4 guests at this meeting—Beckie Perry, Elizabeth Eaves, Melissa Kolbush, and Kathleen Kolbush.

Meet Your Fellow Quilter (a new program started at February's meeting): Shawn interviewed Nancy Norris. Shawn will try to get a write-up of this interview to Judy Poole for April's newsletter.

Family Funday: Suzanna Fox reported that this year's Family Funday was a success despite the fact that only 75 people attended the event. Suzanna thought that the low attendance was due to a trifecta of events occurring simultaneously—Ramadan, the MacArthur construction, and Spring Break. Those that did attend enjoyed the activities. Sara Schacht led a new collage activity in the Teen Lab which was also well received. Suzanna thanked all those members who made kits for this event.

Angel Quilts/Love Thy Pet Beds: Ginnie North announced that the Guild's board members decided, after much consultation and discussion, to reduce the number of points for completed dog beds from 2 points to 1. Also, regarding volunteer points, Ginnie has started planning the 48-Hour Class for next year.

Fall 2024 Retreat: Ginny announced that she will start taking money for the Fall retreat at the April meeting. Total cost is \$305. It will be held October 10-13 at the Red Boot retreat center. She has to turn in final payments 30 days before the Retreat.

2024 Quilt Show: Susan Turk reported that there is only 1 Irving Quilt Guild entry currently in the system. The entry process is much easier this year. The Quilt Show is August 1-3. Final deadline for entries is May 28th. Minis have a separate form. The Show has 2,000 sponsorships for prizes for winners. She already has the T-shirts; no orders will be made. They will cost \$18 at the Guild meetings; \$20 at the door. The Guild keeps any T-shirt money made at Guild meetings. It will receive a portion of the T-shirt money made at the Show.

Carol Cook reminded members that entries need to contain recognizable pictures of the quilts—no pictures of just fabric and a pattern. Quilt turn-in will be the Sunday before the Show opens. Carol encouraged entrants to thoroughly review the quilt show categories before selecting a specific category for their quilt.

<u>Quilt Show Booth</u>: Shawn reminded everyone that the theme is bees. Ginnie purchased some black and yellow fabric which can be used for bee-themed items. Please contact Shawn if you have any ideas or questions.

May Wounded Veterans Picnic: Carol announced that the picnic would be held Sunday, May 19th. There will be 22 new guys there. She would like to have 25 quilts made. Please return her kits or any other patriotic quilts to her by the April meeting. She will provide updates on the Guild's Facebook page.

General Meeting Minutes: Ernestine Chipman asked for any corrections to the minutes for the February General Meeting, as published in the March 2024 newsletter. The Minutes were unanimously approved by a voice vote.

March Program: Dorene Joyce was the speaker. She provided a trunk show illustrating her journey through the various methods of quilting, especially applique, collage, and thread painting. She encouraged everyone not to be afraid to try different methods and discover what works for you.

Show and Tell: Ann Lawrence, substituting for Donna, awarded 4 red points and some fabric to Pansy.

Door Prizes ended the meeting. The President adjourned the meeting at 8:40 p.m.



APPLE ENCHILADAS

INGREDIENTS

- 1 (21 ounce) cans apple fruit filling and topping (or other fruit fillings)
- 6 (8 inches) flour tortillas
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/3 cup butter or 1/3 cup margarine
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 cup water

PREPARATION

Spoon fruit filling evenly down centers of tortillas. Sprinkle with cinnamon.

Roll up, and place, seam side down, in a lightly greased baking dish.

Bring butter and next 3 ingredients to a boil. Reduce heat, and simmer, stirring constantly 3 minutes. Pour over enchiladas: let stand 30 minutes. Bake at 350 for 20 minutes

Mexicorn Rotel Dip

Ingredients:

4 oz cream cheese, softened 1/2 cup sour cream

- 1/4 cup mayo
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp pepper
- 2 tsp garlic powder
- 2 tsp onion powder
- 1/4 tsp smoked paprika

1 tsp granulated sugar

15.25 oz canned whole kernel sweet corn, drained 10 oz Rotel diced tomatoes and green chilies, drained

- 2 cups shredded Mexican cheese blend
- 1 cup chopped green onions 1 tbsp grated yellow onion

Directions:

Dump the softened cream cheese, sour cream and mayo into a large mixing bowl.

Add the salt, pepper, garlic powder, onion powder, smoked paprika and granulated sugar to the bowl.

Use an electric mixer to whip all of the ingredients together until smooth.

Add the corn and Rotel to the bowl. Stir well.

Add the shredded cheese, chopped green onions and grated yellow onion to the bowl.

Stir well again.

Cover the bowl and place it in the refrigerator for at least 2 hours before serving. Serve with chips and/or crackers for dipping. Enjoy!

Flannel Receiving Blankets—50per bag 10 points.



Title: The Women (2024)

Author:Kristin Hannah

Genre: Historical Women's Fiction

Disclaimer: have tissue handy it will make your eyes sweat. Also, a good chance it'll tick you off, but it's very likely the best book I've read since Kristin Hannah's last release 3 years ago. The Four Winds

Women can be heroes. When twenty-year-old nursing student Frances "Frankie" McGrath hears these words, it is a revelation. Raised in the sun-drenched, idyllic world of Southern California and sheltered by her conservative parents, she has always prided herself on doing the right thing. But in 1965, the world is changing, and she suddenly dares to imagine a different future for herself. When her brother ships out to serve in Vietnam, she joins the Army Nurse Corps and follows his path.

As green and inexperienced as the men sent to Vietnam to fight, Frankie is over-whelmed by the chaos and destruction of war. Each day is a gamble of life and death, hope and betrayal; friendships run deep and can be shattered in an instant. In war, she meets—and becomes one of—the lucky, the brave, the broken, and the lost.

But war is just the beginning for Frankie and her veteran friends. The real battle lies in coming home to a changed and divided America, to angry protesters, and to a country that wants to forget Vietnam.

The Women is the story of one woman gone to war, but it shines a light on all women who put themselves in harm's way and whose sacrifice and commitment to their country has too often been forgotten. A novel about deep friendships and bold patriotism, *The Women* is a richly drawn story with a memorable heroine whose idealism and courage under fire will come to define an era.

I cut again and pressed each piece preparing now to sew, But the daylight quickly faded and the light was just too low.

So, I went to bed and rested all while dreaming of the show with Quilts lined up and ribbons and some quilters that I know. We laughed and talked and then we dined, returning to the show. I woke up, and with coffee returned to my favorite room to sew what I hoped would be a winner and auction well after this show.

Sewed again till midnight, thinking of quilters who've passed on, remembering their lessons and the encouragement I lean on.

This mini quilt is finished now complete with a label and sleeve to be entered in the show and win I do believe!


