### #3. Quilt Show August 1st, 2nd and 3rd



Date: May 16, 2024

Shawn Carr called the meeting to order at 6:55 p.m.

Pansy Shehee had hip replacement surgery last week and is recovering well. Susan Doe also had hip replacement surgery and is doing well. Alene' Winn's partner, Millard, who has been in and out of the hospital recently with a prostate infection, has received new medication which is helping him to recover. Jackie encouraged everyone to send Pansy, Sue, and Susan a card to cheer them up.

Birthdays: Jackie announced the following birthdays—Susan Turk, Barbara Coughlin, Mae Harless, Cynthia Jauregar, and Ginnie North. Everyone sang Happy Birthday to all these members.

Guests and New Members: One new member joined, Yvonne Stillman.

Meet Your Fellow Quilter (a new program started at February's meeting): Jackie interviewed Guild member, Thenia Haynie.

2024 Quilt Show: The deadline is fast approaching—May 28<sup>th</sup> Susan Turk announced that she only has 19 Guild entries. The Guild entries usually average around 30 quilts. She can help anyone having trouble entering their quilt. She encouraged anyone knowing of a young quilter to have them enter their quilt. The Junior entry class is for quilters up to 17 years old. Jerry Bowen is collecting minis which are due June 15<sup>th</sup>. There will be a need for volunteers for both the Guild Booth and for the Expo. There will be a Sign-up Genius soon for volunteers. Jeanne Sullivan is managing ticket sales--\$12 from her, \$15 at the door. Jeanne asked members to please have exact change or use a check. The Guild receives all the proceeds from Jeanne's "pink" tickets; 50% of the sales from "the door".

<u>Quilt Show Booth</u>: Shawn thanked everyone who has contributed items for the Booth. She has plenty of beethemed items so feel free to contribute other items.

Fall 2024 Retreat: Ginny announced that she is taking payments starting with this meeting. Deadline for final payments: August meeting. The total cost is \$305. It will be held October 10-13 at the Red Boot retreat center.

April General Meeting Minutes: Ernestine Chipman asked for any changes/corrections to both the March and April General Meeting Minutes as published. Both were unanimously approved as published. Ernestine also reported that no one had responded to her about the invitation from the Irving Archives and Museum to participate in an upcoming traveling exhibit, "Thrift Styles," an exhibit which explores the use of feed sacks to make clothing and other household items.

May Program: The May program was in 2 parts--the Mini Quilt contest with money awards for the top 3 winners and a Scrap/Angel Quilt Ideas trunk show from Linda Cole. There will be no workshop in May. Members voted on minis during the break. The winners were: 1<sup>st</sup> Place (\$100)—Linda Cole; 2<sup>nd</sup> Place (\$75)—Carol Cook; and 3<sup>rd</sup> Place (\$50)—Sara Schacht. Debra Kay donated the prize money. Linda suggested searching the Internet/YouTube videos which she found provided some great, unique ideas for scraps. She showed some examples of blocks that she had made using these ideas.

June Program: Will be the Summer Potluck dinner with a bee theme. Gayle Henegar passed around a sign-up sheet for members to bring one or more items for a sandwich charcuterie-themed dinner. There will be no workshop in June.

Other announcements: Shawn asked members who attended the April Workshop with Dorene Joyce to provide some feedback. Sara Schacht reported that it was a particularly good class that seemed daunting at first, but as she saw what others were doing, she was able to complete the project. Cynthia Gladden thought that she did a particularly good job of teaching. Shawn suggested that the Guild might request a future workshop with her.

Show and Tell: Ann Witherspoon was awarded 4 points and a pink Show ticket.

Door Prizes ended the meeting. The President adjourned the meeting at 8:11 p.m.

#### **Mexicorn Rotel Dip**

#### **Ingredients:**

4 oz cream cheese, softened

1/2 cup sour cream

1/4 cup mayo

1 tsp salt

1 tsp pepper

2 tsp garlic powder

2 tsp onion powder

1/4 tsp smoked paprika

1 tsp granulated sugar

15.25 oz canned whole kernel sweet corn, drained


10 oz Rotel diced tomatoes and green chilies, drained

2 cups shredded Mexican cheese blend

1 cup chopped green onions

1 tbsp grated yellow onion

**Directions:** 



Add the salt, pepper, garlic powder, onion powder, smoked paprika and granulated sugar to the bowl.

Use an electric mixer to whip all of the ingredients together until smooth.

Add the corn and Rotel to the bowl.

Stir well.

Add the shredded cheese, chopped green onions and grated yellow onion to the bowl.

Stir well again.

Cover the bowl and place it in the refrigerator for at least 2 hours before serving. Serve with chips and/or crackers for dipping.

If you've ever been creating your quilt binding and felt like you could use an extra hand, then you need to try using <u>binding clips</u>. Made especially for quilting, these handy tools hold your binding in place without leaving holes in your fabric, like <u>pins</u>. And here's a bonus advanced quilting hack: you can also use these to clip multiple fabric pieces together to keep them organized!

# Cabbage Soup

1 large cabbage.

2 small onions diced

2 cans of stewed tomatoes.

Wash your hands. Clean hands are good for our fabric as well.



The Longest Ride (2014) Nicholas Sparks

Ira Levinson is in trouble. Ninety-one years old and stranded and injured after a car crash, he struggles to retain consciousness until a blurry image materializes beside him: his beloved wife Ruth, who passed away nine years ago. Urging him to hang on, she forces him to remain alert by recounting the stories of their lifetime together - how they met, the precious paintings they collected together, the dark days of WWII and its effect on them and their families. Ira knows that Ruth can't possibly be in the car with him, but he clings to her words and his memories, reliving the sorrows and everyday joys that defined their marriage.

A few miles away, at a local bull-riding event, a Wake Forest College senior's life is about to change. Recovering from a recent break-up, Sophia Danko meets a young cowboy named Luke, who bears little resemblance to the privileged frat boys she has encountered at school. Through Luke, Sophia is introduced to a world in which the stakes of survival and success, ruin and reward -- even life and death - loom large in everyday life. As she and Luke fall in love, Sophia finds herself imagining a future far removed from her plans -- a future that Luke has the power to rewrite . . . if the secret he's keeping doesn't destroy it first.

Ira and Ruth. Sophia and Luke. Two couples who have little in common, and who are separated by years and experience. Yet their lives will converge with unexpected poignancy, reminding us all that even the most difficult decisions can yield extraordinary journeys: beyond despair, beyond death, to the farthest reaches of the human heart.



## APPLE ENCHILADAS

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 (21 ounce) cans apple fruit filling and topping ( or other fruit fillings)
- · 6 (8 inches) flour tortillas
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/3 cup butter or 1/3 cup margarine
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 cup water

#### PREPARATION

Spoon fruit filling evenly down centers of tortillas.

Sprinkle with cinnamon.

Roll up, and place, seam side down, in a lightly greased baking dish.

Bring butter and next 3 ingredients to a boil.

Reduce heat, and simmer, stirring constantly 3 minutes.

Pour over enchiladas: let stand 30 minutes.

Bake at 350 for 20 minutes
