IRVING QUILT GUILD GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Date: August 15, 2024

Shawn Carr called the meeting to order at 6:58 p.m. with a welcome and a "thank you" to Gayle Henegar for the refreshments that she brought to the meeting—fresh-baked cookies and watermelon. Announced that the Galla Award will be awarded at the September General Meeting. Look for photos of all the Guild's entries in a separate email from Susan Turk and respond with the number of your selection. She also has 1 free ticket for the Red River Quilt Guild's quilt show in September.

Sunshine and Shadows: Shadows: Jackie Wagner updated everyone on Pam Chenault's condition. She is doing much better, in rehab for a week, home next week, walking with a walker. Sunshine: Jackie still has kittens to give away.

August Birthdays: Everyone sang "Happy Birthday" to Rachel Brown, Connie Angeles, Carol Cook, Wanda Rolf, and Sarah Schacht.

July General Meeting Minutes: Ernestine Chipman asked for any additions or corrections to the General Meeting Minutes for July as published in the August newsletter. No additions or changes were requested. Minutes were approved unanimously.

2024 Quilt Show: Shawn and Jerry Bowen provided the following results and suggestions. The Guild made \$4,000—more money than last year on minis, tickets, and T-Shirts. The Show Booth sold "a lot of stuff" --only 2 ½ tubs left; bee items were popular; Christmas items sold-- but sale ticket per person, not as high. Theme next year is "There is No Place Like Home". Shawn's suggested theme: All Christmas booth with higher ticket items—between \$20 and \$25. Congratulated all the members who won ribbons and thanked everyone for their participation in the Show.

Guests and New Members: None announced.

Fall Retreat and Bylaws Revisions: Ginnie North made 2 announcements—1) that the retreat is full and 2) she has placed Bylaws revisions on each table which will also be published in the September newsletter and need membership approval.

2025 Nominations: Judy Poole, Nominations Committee Chair, will be asking for nominations from the floor at the September General Meeting. Membership will vote in November and new officers/chairs will assume their positions in January.

Programs and Workshops: Donna Reid made several announcements: 1) **September program:** bring an old quilt, but not necessarily one you made, for a membership trunk show; 2) **October program and workshop**: Bonnie Sloan, coloring your quilt; and 3) Showed several blocks made from half-square triangles to make into Angel Quilts; will email instructions.

August Program: Beverly Ingram from Quilters Dream briefly described rulers which should be part of a quilter's collection—1 long, wide ruler (i.e. 5x24, or 6x24); a short, easier-to-carry ruler like a 6x12; a strip ruler--uses it for T-shirt quilts and to square up blocks (likes June Taylor's Strip Cut Plus); and Deb Tucker's Wing Clipper for Flying Geese. Her tips: Buy rulers you can read; the same brand for all rulers; and measure your rulers together. Handed out her tips on backings and a chart for cutting strips in ¼" increments. Also distributed a flyer for the upcoming Sweetest Summer Shop Hop (August 24th – September 7th), in which Quilters Dream will be participating.

Show and Tell: Donna awarded 4 points to Gail Walsh with a fat quarter pack.

Door Prizes and \$10-Quilters Dream Gift Cards give-away ended the meeting. Meeting adjourned at 8:25 p.m.

IQG Proposed Bylaws Amendments 2024

The Guild Membership will vote on these changes at the September meeting.

- 3.03 The schedule of payment of annual dues by Guild members shall be set by the Board and published in the newsletter, on the website, and yearly membership book. The category of members is:
 - **Active Members**
 - **Charter Members**
 - Junior Members
- 4.07 Voting will be by ballot or proxy. Ballots will be counted by the Parliamentarian and sealed until destroyed in the January following the election by the Parliamentarian.
- 4.08 The officers shall be installed at the December meeting. All officers and chairmen shall assume their duties at the January meeting. All records, and property used by each outgoing officer shall be transferred to the new board members at the December Board meeting, or Open Guild meeting.
- 4.09 An office vacancy shall be filled by the board or the nominating committee, and the nominee(s) will be presented for election at the next regularly scheduled guild meeting. A simple majority vote shall elect. A committee chair vacancy shall be filled with the approval of the president.
- 4.10 An officer may be removed with cause by a unanimous vote of the Executive Board and by a 2/3 vote of the members present at the next regular meeting.
- 4.11 Elected officers shall not serve more than two years consecutively in the same position unless re-elected for a second term by the members at the annual election. Elected officers shall be the only voting members at the Board meetings.
- 5.04 The Secretary shall keep accurate records of the regular and executive board meetings, and shall conduct the general correspondence of the Guild. The officer shall submit the minutes of the regular meeting to the newsletter for publication each month. The officer shall track and maintain an inventory of all Guild Property
- 5.07 Revised and Moved to Article IV, 4.11
- 7.01 The standing committees shall be: Angel Quilts, Audit, Community Service, Door Prizes, Historian, Hospitality/ Refreshments, Keeper Quilts, Love Thy Baby, Love Thy Pet, Membership, Newsletter, Nomination, Parliamentarian, Patriotic Quilts, Quilt Show, Quilt Show Booth, Quilts of Valor, Sunshine and Shadow/Welcoming, TAQG, and Webmaster.
- Committee listings moved from 7.03 to 7.01 other changes below
 - Quilt Show Booth- shall be responsible for planning, and coordinating a Guild booth at the Quilt Show.
 - Quilts of Valor shall be responsible for collecting and distributing all Quilts of Valor. This position shall give a list of volunteer points to the 2nd Vice President.
 - Raffle Quilt shall be responsible for the planning and construction of the quilts, as well as the sale and record keeping of the quilt tickets. This position shall turn in ticket sales to Treasurer.
 - Scholarship shall be responsible for reviewing the applications submitted by the local school board, make the selection and present the scholarship to the recipient at the May meeting.
 - TAGG shall be responsible for attending TAGG meetings and providing a report to the Board. TAGG may shall consist of two members and an alternate.
- 9.01 In the event of the dissolution of the Irving Quilt Guild, Inc., all assets shall be-assigned to an organization chosen by the membership split equally between a Patriotic Quilt program, Scottish Rite Hospital, and the Love Thy Baby organization assigned to an organization chosen by the membership in accordance with Section 501c (3) of the Internal Revenue Code or corresponding sections of any future Federal tax code.
- The Irving Quilt Guild, Inc. will have a monthly newsletter.
 - Newsletters will be published on the Guild Website and distributed by mail or by email to all members two weeks prior to the next regular guild meeting.
 - Names, addresses and email addresses of all new members may will be published added to in the monthly newsletter with their expressed permission.
 - The newsletter may carry guilt and craft related paid advertisements.
- Each member will receive a membership book. Extra or replacement books may be purchased for \$3.00. \$4.00.
- The Guild's computer will be passed from the existing Treasurer to the newly elected Treasurer. Revised and-Moved to Article IV, 4.08.

Wash your hands. Clean hands are good for our fabric as well.



The Good Daughter (2016) Karin Slaughter Crime Thriller



Two girls are forced into the woods at gunpoint. One runs for her life. One is left behind...

48 Hr. Class- 2025

Guess what??? I am going to be your teacher for the next 48 hr. class. I have a pattern that I saw online that looked fairly easy but different. I presented the idea to the board, and it was accepted and I "volunteered" to teach it. If you can sew a half square triangle and do the flip and sew triangles, then you have this quilt well in hand. I am letting you in a few things now for two reasons...first is if you don't already have your volunteer points made then you still have time to get more made and earn your way in to the class. Second is I want you to be able to spend some time thinking about how you want your quilt to look when it's finished.

If you came to the meeting on Thursday, you saw my version. I will tell you that the pattern picture was all in green tones...medium to light. They used ¾ yd of 5 different prints. The lightest color was also used on the 9 patch connector blocks. MY sample did not use the same colors on the 9 patch so I didn't need much fabric of the lightest color. We will get into more about fabric amounts in the coming months.

As you keep your eyes open for a fabric sale or just use your stash just keep in mind these thoughts: Yes, the pattern is a tree design but no one said you couldn't make yours out of unlikely tree fabric. Think Christmas fabric for the trees and maybe gold for the 9 patch?? Or Halloween fabrics? Fall colors would be nice. Blues for cold months with snowflake fabrics. I used batiks from my stash in off the wall colors of blues, purples and greens. It's your quilt...make it match your personality. I would love to see your interpretation of the pattern.

I am giving you time to think about this class. With the show around the corner and Plano show right after then you can maybe find something that "rocks your tree world" and find that jumping off point for the colors. I just want everyone to have a good time with this so I am teasing you with ideas.

Get your thoughts a brewing...I don't want to "Leaf" anyone behind !!
